

## CHAPTER 74: PARKING SCHEDULES ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Town of Rose Hill Board of Commissioners of Rose Hill, North Carolina, that the **Parking Schedules** found in **Chapter 74** be amended so as to add the following text:

### **Schedule III. Parking Prohibited At All Times If Weight Exceeds 20,000 Pounds**

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to leave standing any truck, trailer or semi-trailer, motor vehicle or any apparatus with more than three (3) axles weighing more than 20,000 pounds, including the trailer and any goods or merchandise which is being hauled, within the corporate limits of town unless otherwise permitted in a designated parking area. Designated parking area excludes any residential area within the corporate limits; must be zoned Highway Business, Industrial or Central Business as well as allowable and accessible per the zoning guidelines set forth in the Town of Rose Hill Code of Ordinances Chapter 73: Traffic Schedules and Chapter 154: Zoning Code. In addition, a zoning permit must be issued by the Town of Rose Hill Zoning Administrator before said area is considered a designated parking area.

Penalty, See G.S. § 14-4(b) If any person shall violate an ordinance of a county, city, or town regulating the operation or parking of vehicles, he shall be responsible for an infraction and shall be required to pay a penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

### **Schedule IV. Disposition of Truck, Trailer, Semi-trailer, Motor Vehicle or Apparatus Found in Violation**

When any truck, trailer, semi-trailer, motor vehicle or apparatus exceeding the weight restriction set forth in Schedule III above, is left standing upon the street or right-of-way or any other location not permitted for such use within the corporate limits for a period of more than 24 hours, the owner shall be deemed to have appointed any investigating officer his or her agent for the purpose of arranging for the transportation and safe storage of the vehicle, and the investigating officer shall be deemed the legal possessor of the motor vehicle within the meaning of that term as in appears in G.S. § 44A-1(1).
