- Over-the-counter drugs
- Controlled substances
- Pet medications

Guidelines:

- Needles and sharps will NOT be accepted.
- Do NOT bring medications to events before or after the listed times.
- Please keep medications in their original containers. You may block out personal information but keep the drug name visible.
- Households only. Businesses should call 920-683-4333 for disposal information.
- Practice safe storage by keeping your medications in a secured location.
- Never share your prescriptions.

Mercury Thermometer Exchange:

As part of this Drug Collection event you can bring your mercury fever thermometers and receive a digital thermometer. All mercury and mercury containing devices will be accepted; however, only household thermometers are eligible for exchange. There is a limit of one digital thermometer per household while supplies last.
