Determination of Significance Under the NYS State Environmental Quality Review Act and its Implementing Regulations in 6 NYCRR Part 617 (collectively, "SEQRA")

WHEREAS, in September 2023 the Town of Amenia Planning Board ("Planning Board") received a preliminary plat application (the "Application") from SL Keane Stud, LLC ("Applicant") pursuant to Chapter 105 of the Amenia Town Code ("Subdivision Law") for a subdivision of land requiring Planning Board approval. On July 28, 2025, the Applicant amended this application to propose 27 lots, 23 of which are proposed for conceptual residential development, 2 lots for existing agricultural and equestrian uses, and 2 forested lots for conservation purposes; and

WHEREAS, SEQRA review of the Application requires that the Planning Board consider both the proposed subdivision as well as the reasonably foreseeable residential build-out of the subdivision as the "Proposed Action" consistent with 6 NYCRR § 617.3(g); and

WHEREAS, the Proposed Action would be undertaken on lands comprising 605.7± acres owned by the Applicant (SBL ## 132000-7166-00-403720 and 132000-7167-00-212034) that are located on Old Route 22 and Depot Hill Road in the Town of Amenia, Dutchess County, New York (the "Site"); and

WHEREAS, the Site is comprised of lands classified Rural Residential ("RR") and Rural Agricultural ("RA") by the Town of Amenia Zoning Law ("Zoning Law"); and

WHEREAS, the Application was accompanied by Part 1 of a SEQRA Full Environmental Assessment Form ("FEAF"), dated September 8, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2023, after reviewing the FEAF Part 1, the Planning Board classified the Proposed Action as a Type 1 SEQRA action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.4(b)(6)(i) and declared its intention to act as lead agency for a coordinated environmental review of the Proposed Action, directing the circulation of a Notice of Intent to Designate a SEQRA Lead Agency and other materials to involved and interested agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board's notice of intent to serve as SEQRA lead agency was sent to the following interested and involved local, state and federal agencies:

- a. Town of Amenia Zoning Officer;
- b. Town of Amenia Highway Department;
- c. Dutchess County Planning Department;
- d. Dutchess County Department of Health;
- e. Dutchess County Department of Public Works;
- f. NYS Department of Environmental Conservation;
- g. NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Resources;
- h. US Army Corps of Engineers;
- i. US Fish and Wildlife Service; and

WHEREAS, none of aforementioned involved and/or interested agencies objected to the Planning Board's notice of intent to serve as lead agency in reviewing the Proposed Action pursuant to SEQRA and, accordingly, the Planning Board has been established as lead agency for coordinated SEQRA review of the Proposed Action; and

WHEREAS, as required by 6 NYCRR § 617.7, the Planning Board has reviewed the Application and Parts 1 and 2 of the FEAF and other information provided by the Applicant, and has analyzed the identified relevant areas of environmental concern based upon available information to determine if the Proposed Action may have a significant adverse impact on the environment; and

WHEREAS, based upon this review, the Planning Board has identified the following visual impacts of the Proposed Action and its inconsistency with community plans and community character as potential significant adverse environmental impacts that may result from the Proposed Action, requiring the preparation of an environmental impact statement ("EIS") for those impacts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Planning Board, acting as lead agency for coordinated SEQRA review of the Proposed Action, makes a positive declaration pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.7 that the Proposed Action has the potential to result in one or more significant adverse impacts to the environment and that an environmental impact statement must be prepared for the Proposed Action in accordance with 6 NYCRR §§ 617.9 and 617.10 to consider the potential impacts of, alternatives to, and mitigation for the Proposed Action and to weigh social, economic and environmental factors early in the planning and decision-making process for the Proposed Action; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman is authorized to complete and sign an FEAF Part 3 for the Proposed Action, issuing a positive SEQRA declaration based on this resolution and the attached FEAF Parts 1 and 2; notice of the Planning Board's positive declaration, including this resolution, shall be filed with the Planning Board Secretary and distributed to all involved and interested agencies and other interested parties; and notice of the positive declaration shall be published in the Environmental Notice Bulletin; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the EIS shall focus on the potential visual impacts of the Proposed Action and its potential inconsistency with community plans and community character, along with any other relevant issues identified prior to the finalization of the scope for

the EIS pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.8 and shall consider reasonable alternatives to the Proposed Action; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Brief Description of Proposed Action (include purpose or need): The applicant is proposing a conventional non-realty subdivision of two (2) existing parcels totaling approximately +/-605.7-acres (the "Site"). The subdivision will result in twenty-seven (27) lots: twenty-three (23) residential-agricultural (farmstead) lots, two (2) agricultural/equestrian lots that will maintain the existing Keane Stud equestrian facilities, and two (2) conservation parcels containing most of the Site's forested land. The subdivision will result in a net gain of twenty-five (25) new parcels. Residential lots range in size from 7 to 41 acres and are proposed to be accessed via three (3) private "Rural Lanes," as defined by the Town of Amenia Zoning Code, which will include the installation of equestrian trails, landscaping improvements, and all required stormwater management practices. No residential build-out or any other construction activity is proposed as part of the Subdivision application. Any future use of the new lots will be subject to development restrictions set forth in a declaration to be recorded in the Dutchess County Clerk's office against the entire Site, with residential perimeters and building areas to be identified therein and on the subdivision plat. In addition, any development of the 23 residential-agricultural lots will be served by separate private wells and subsurface sewage disposal systems and will be subject to site plan review. For the purpose of evaluating potential SEQR impacts, the Proposed Action includes estimates for the conceptual development of the proposed 23 deed restricted parcels with a 4-bedroom residence and associated improvements (ie: driveways, water/wastewater systems, land coverage changes etc).

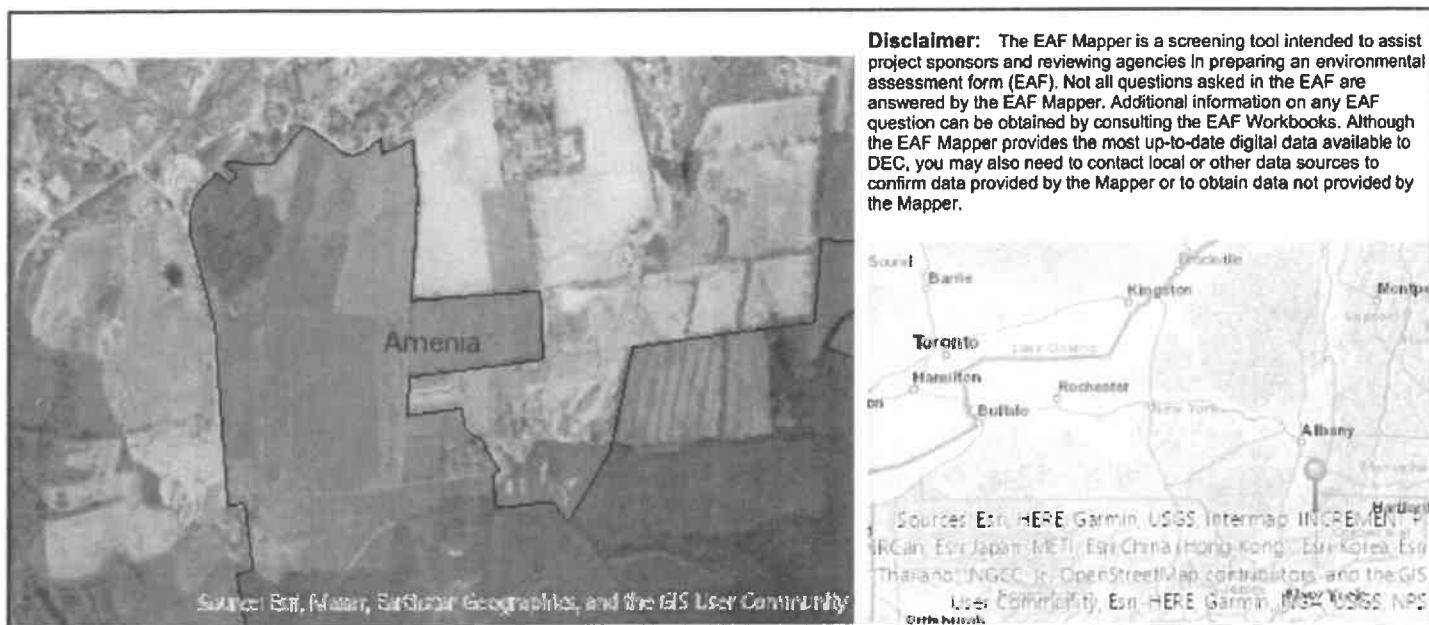
