2018 Budget Goals

- Comply with Tax Levy Cap & Municipal Appropriations Cap.
- Maintain a flat municipal tax levy.
- Maintain current level of services, while managing the overall budget.
- Prioritize spending needs:
 - Provide more assistance to the First Aid.
 - Shared services with new partners, such as Fire Department and Township of Freehold.
 - Manage the Streets & Roads, Vehicle Maintenance & Gasoline line items after spending over \$70,000 in 3 States of Emergency in the first quarter.
 - Master Plan component: Affordable Housing
 - Maintaining current fleet of vehicles
 - Robust, yet responsible, Capital Budget
 - Additional headcount
- The Budget cycle is "State Review" this year, which means this Budget must be filed with the State, and reviewed prior to public hearing/adoption. "State Review" is every 3 years.






Annual Net Valuation Taxable




Local Municipal Tax Rate



Amount to be Raised by Taxation Local Municipal Purposes









Net Debt as a Percentage of 3-Year Average Equalized Valuation




•N.J.S.A. 40A:2-5 allows a municipality to incur debt up to a maximum of 3.5% of the 3-year average equalized valuation in any year.




