
- 2019 Budget Goals
  Comply with State Guidelines on Tax Levy Cap & Municipal Appropriations Cap.
- Maintain current level of services, while managing the overall budget.
- Prioritize spending needs:
  - Provide continued assistance to the First Aid.
  - Continue Shared Services with our partners.
  - Manage the Streets & Roads, Vehicle Maintenance & Gasoline line items after spending over \$39,000 in 4 States of Emergency in the first quarter.
  - Master Plan component: Fair Share Housing Plan & Farmland Preservation Plan.
  - Maintaining current fleet of vehicles.
  - Robust, yet responsible, Capital Budget for Roads, Technology Upgrades & Fire, Burglar & Security.
  - Increase financial & human resources at Township parks.
  - Repurpose 1-2 DPW pickup trucks for use by Construction Inspectors.
  - Additional headcount, due to attrition & increased scope of responsibilities.
- The Budget cycle is "Self Review" this year, which means this Budget must be filed with the State, but not reviewed prior to public hearing/adoption. "State Review" is every 3 years.





#### **Analysis of 2019 Budget Revenues**







Net Debt as a Percentage of 3-Year Average Equalized Valuation




•N.J.S.A. 40A:2-5 allows a municipality to incur debt up to a maximum of 3.5% of the 3-year average equalized valuation in any year.


