TOWN MEETINGS

The Town Board regular meetings are held at 7:00 p.m. on the first Thursday of every month at the Town Hall. Residents are invited to attend and discuss their Town concerns at that time. The Plan Commission meets the third Thursday of every month at 6:30 p.m. The Park and Recreation Commission meet the third Thursday of the month at 4:00 p.m.

The official newspaper for the Town is the Oconomowoc Enterprise, a weekly paper distributed on Thursday, any legal notices pertaining to the Town of Summit can be found in that publication. Agendas are posted on the town website and on five bulletin boards throughout the Town, including the bulletin board outside of the Town Hall. Minutes of the Town Board and Plan Commission meetings are also posted on the website.

GARBAGE, YARD WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES

The Town of Summit currently contracts with VEOLIA for garbage, recyclables and yard waste pickup. The garbage and recyclables are picked up every Thursday. A yearly planner is included each December with the tax bills and provides the yard waste schedule and rules and regulations from Veolia.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Waukesha County operates four year-round household hazardous waste drop-off sites for residents and five special one-day collections in spring and fall.

ELECTIONS

Town Board members are elected for a two year term. In April 2009 two Supervisor positions and the Chairperson seat were up for election and four candidates ran for the two Supervisor seats. Supervisor Elaine Kraut had turned in her Non-Candidacy paperwork and was not on the ballot for re-election. Two new Supervisors were elected: Jim Breen and Scott Piefer. Chairman Len Susa ran unopposed. There were 917 voters for a 22% turnout.

DOG LICENSING

Dog licenses are required for all dogs over five months of age, to avoid a \$5.00 late fee, dogs need to be licensed prior to April 1st of each year. The annual fee is \$6.00 for spayed/neutered dogs and \$11.00 for unaltered dogs. In 2009 the Town issued 393 licenses.



TAX COLLECTION AND LEVY INFORMATION

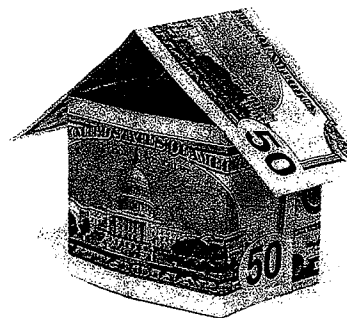
Real estate taxes can be paid in two installments, the first payment is due on or before January 31st. The second payment is due on or before July 31st. The Town of Summit Treasurer only collects real property taxes through January 31st, after that, any payment is made to the Waukesha County Treasurer.

To assure the Town of Summit is receiving the appropriate allocation of State shared revenues, please be certain when registering or renewing your vehicle that you designate on the forms that you live in the TOWN OF SUMMIT, WAUKESHA COUNTY.

The Board of Review met during August 2009 to hold hearings at which 11 property owners appealed to the Board of Review.

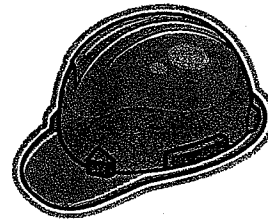
TOWN MANAGER REPORT

Nation-wide economic conditions impacted on the Town of Summit in 2009. The outline of building permit activity shows the affect of the recession on new construction and general permit levels. Because of the national economy there was no push by the State of Wisconsin to construct the new I-94 / Sawyer Road interchange in 2009. This project has been postponed until 2015, unless local conditions cause this project to be needed sooner. These economic influences also resulted in the slowest construction rate in over 10 years. The Ravinia Park and Brightwater Subdivisions were completed early in 2009; however, at the end of the year only one single-family home is under construction on these 54 lots.

Construction was completed on the Wilkinson Clinic portion of the Aurora Medical Center and the clinic opened in August. Summit staff also issued an occupancy permit on the Lake Country Landing and Rehabilitation Center in November. This brought two major employment centers and medical facilities to Summit in addition to the existing centers at ODTG and Rogers Memorial Hospital.

Organizationally, the Town of Summit and five neighboring communities completed a set of boundary agreements. This set of documents was approved by the State of Wisconsin in June. At the close of 2009 Summit has fixed boundaries with all its neighbors except the City of Delafield. The Waukesha County Circuit Court received a petition for incorporation from over 50 town residents. This petition was forwarded to the Wisconsin Department of Administration for review and recommendation. The Town staff prepared a set of documents as background for this petition. A public hearing on this proposal was held at the Town Hall in December.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

PERSONNEL

Bill Miller is Lead Person for the Department of Public Works and the Cemetery Sexton. David Dzomba and Jared Beauchamp are full-time Department of Public Works employees.

BUDGET

The Town budgeted \$345,440 in 2009 for Public Works operations. An un-audited review of the 2009 actual costs indicate the Highway expenditures to be \$345,448.

ROADS, BRIDGES & CULVERTS

The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining 52 miles of road and road right-of way throughout the Town. Three bridges are maintained and culverts are cleaned to provide better drainage.

SNOW PLOWING

In providing this service, approximately 697 tons of sand and salt mix was used during 2009.

TOWN HALL FACILITIES

To provide the residents with an outlet to recycle their used motor oil, a drop off site is located in the southwest corner of the Town Hall lot. In 2009, 1,300 gallons were collected for which the town receives payment from an independent contractor upon recycling of this oil.

A professional cleaning service cleans the town hall facility twice per week. The 2009 budget amount was \$4,500.00 and the un-audited actual cost was \$4,378.48. The Department of Public Works maintains the Town Hall between the professional cleanings.

CEMETERY

The Summit Cemetery is located one-half mile east of STH 67 (Summit Avenue) on CTH DR (Delafield Road).

Lots are available for purchase to all Town residents for \$600.00 per lot. Bill Miller, Sexton, may be contacted at 567-2422 for the purchase of lots.

Town Staff; Debra Schueler, Renee Person and Bill Miller have taken over duties for Cemetery Secretary, lot sales and general administration of the Cemetery.

With the help of Sheridan Ripplinger and Michael Smith, the Department of Public Works maintained the Cemetery grounds during the spring, summer and fall of 2009.

The Town budgeted \$26,509 for maintenance of the cemetery. An un-audited review of the 2009 actual costs shows an expenditure of \$32,768.

There were 27 burials during 2009.

PARKS

The Department of Public Works is responsible for the caretaking of the Town Parks. This includes Peter Prime Park, William Jones Park and the Genesee Lake Road Park property. During 2009, Jim Franke was hired part-time to help maintain the parklands during the spring, summer and fall of 2009. The Genesee Lake Road Park Sledding Hill was completed and opened for winter activities.

EQUIPMENT

All the highway, cemetery and parks equipment is maintained by the Department of Public Works. The Department of Public Works also does minor maintenance on the police vehicles.

NEW EQUIPMENT

A new plow wing was purchased during 2009.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Town of Summit maintains its own police department and provides 24-hour a day, seven days per week protection to the residents of the Town.

To obtain the services of the Department for non-emergency matters, you may call during regular business hours at 262-567-1134. If there is no officer available when you call, you will receive the voicemail for the department and may leave a message. The officer on duty will check voicemails and return your call.

ACCIDENTS

In 2009 the department investigated a total of 133 accidents. These accidents had a total of 180 vehicles involved, there were a total of 30 parties injured. The department also investigated a total of 39 car vs. deer accidents.

FIRE AND RESCUE INCIDENTS

The department assisted in a total of 207 rescue calls and 30 fire calls in cooperation with the Dousman, Oconomowoc, Okauchee and Summit Fire Departments. Of these rescue calls; the Oconomowoc Fire Ambulance handled 179 calls and the Dousman Fire Ambulance a total of 28. Of the 20 fire calls; the Summit Fire District responded to 13 calls and the Dousman Fire District to 7 calls.

WATER PATROL

The Town of Summit provides lake patrol on the Town's lakes from Memorial Day until Labor Day. The patrol routinely patrols Golden Lake, Silver Lake, Middle Genesee Lake, Lower Neshotah Lake and the Nemahbin Lakes. During 2009 the patrol issued a total of 67 citations for various violations. The water patrol was audited by the Department of Natural Resources in which the patrol was commended as being one of the best in the State and that other patrols should model themselves to the Summit Patrol.

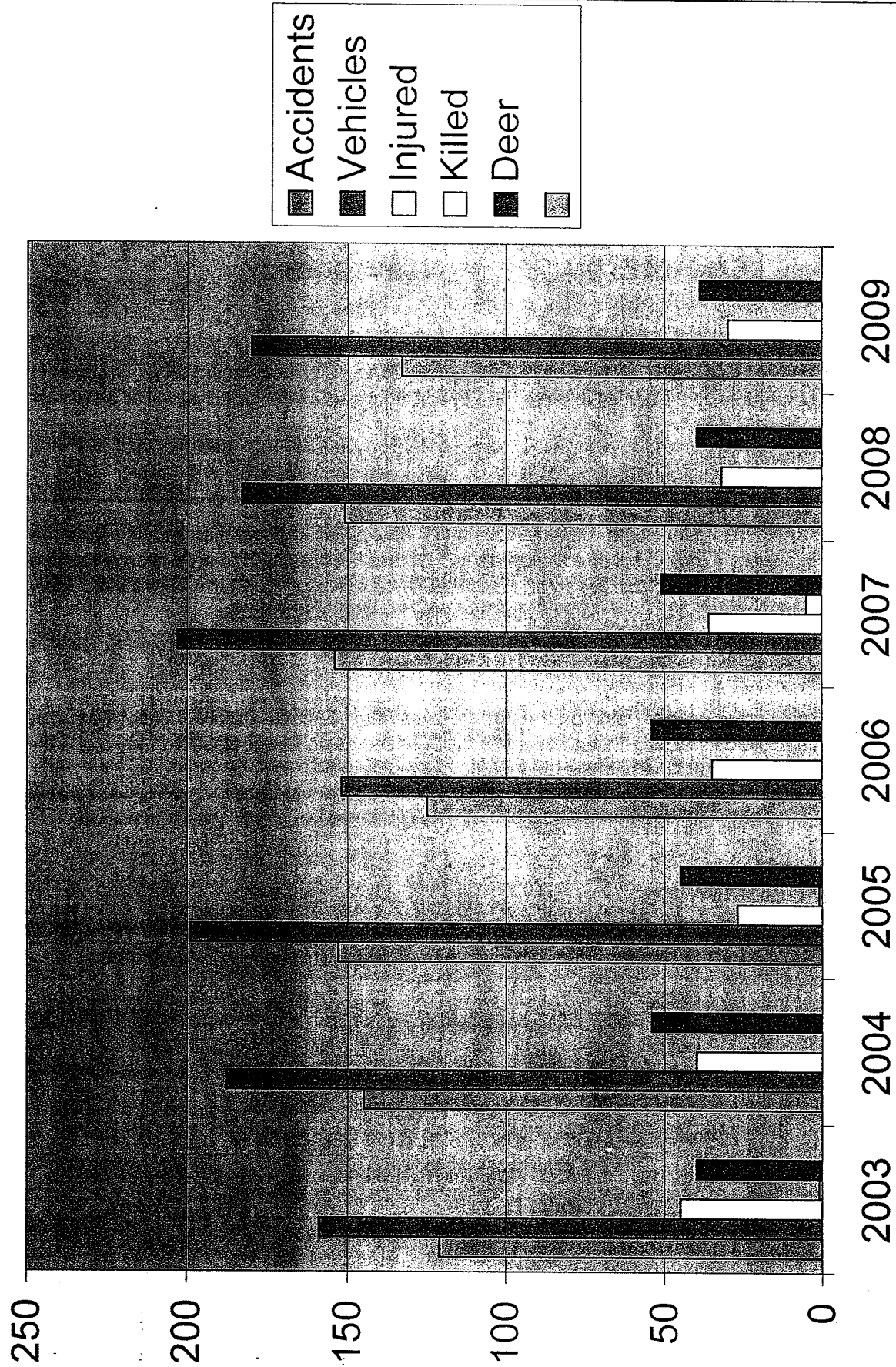
