Yard Waste pick up service runs from April through November and is picked up at the end of your drive at the road. The Calendar on the Village website (and attached) shows the dates of pickup.

A used motor oil dump station including a container for used oil filters; is located southeast of the Village Hall salt shed available for resident use.

#### **Elections**

To save time and avoid lines when voting, please register to vote prior to the next election. You must reside at your Village of Summit residential address for at least 28 consecutive days prior to Election Day. Registration can be done prior to Election Day in the Clerk's office, online at <a href="https://myvote.wi.gov">https://myvote.wi.gov</a> or by mail. You may also register on Election Day.

The Village of Summit is divided into 6 Wards; all voting is at the Village Hall located at 37100 Delafield Road. Polls are open from 7 am to 8 pm on Election Day.

#### **Elected Officials**

## **Police Department**

The Summit Police Department has a staff of 11 full-time officers, including a detective, and a clerk. The Department provides 24-hour police service to both Summit and Dousman. During the summer months, a dedicated lake patrol is staffed by a team of 4 part-time police officers and 3 community service officers. ## **Building Permits**

## **Driveway & Culvert Permits**

A Right-of-Way (ROW) Permit is required PRIOR to the commencement of any work that will disturb any public road or right-of-way. There are a number of requirements for driveways and culverts that are outlined in Section 24 of the Village Code of Ordinances, including width, construction material, and location. Prior to installing a new or replacing an existing driveway or culvert, please ensure that the proposed driveway conforms to Village requirements. ## **Dog License Application** (enclosed)

Wisconsin Statutes require any dog over 5 months old to be licensed in the municipality. Annual dog license fee is \$10.00 for altered male or female and \$15.00 for intact male or female. Licenses are due by March 31 or a \$5 late charge per license will be assessed. A **copy of the rabies vaccination certificate must be provided** with the application. Four or more dogs require a conditional use permit.

# DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

## DRIVEWAY INSTALLATION & RESURFACING REQUIREMENTS

A Right-of-Way (ROW) Permit is required PRIOR to the commencement of any work for the installation or improvement of a driveway within the public right-of-way, except for seal coating of an existing driveway. In addition, any excavation or other type of work that will disturb any public road or right-of-way requires a permit. The public right-of-way is an easement that extends for several feet beyond the improved roadway surface, including sidewalks, parking areas, and grass swales. The ROW permit application is available on the Village of Summit's website and must be submitted to the Public Works Director for review and approval, along with a \$75 fee. Department of Public Works staff will determine if a culvert installation or replacement is required.

There are a number of requirements for driveways that are outlined in Section 24 of the Village Code of Ordinances, including width, construction material, and location. Prior to installing a new or replacing an existing driveway, please ensure that the proposed driveway conforms to Village requirements. Residential, low traffic roads will be plowed once snow or ice accumulation has ended. Bare pavement is not the goal on residential roads, although efforts are made to clear as much snow and ice from the pavement as possible.

# PLANNING AND ZONING

\*\*Permits and Approvals Needed for Construction Activities and/or Change in Use\*\*
All properties in the Village of Summit are required to comply with the Village's Zoning Code. The Zoning Code provides a regulatory framework for land use and aids in achieving a harmonious and compatible relationship between various uses consistent with the rights of property ownership, the general public welfare, and the established goals for community development and character. In order to do this, the Village restricts lot coverage, use of land population density, size and location of structures. Property owners are required to obtain permits or approvals for various activities, including, but not limited to:

- Change in land use
- Land altering activities
- Change in drainage patterns
- Increase in impervious (hard) surfaces, such as new sidewalks, driveways, patios, & rooftops
- Vegetation removal within 75 ft. of the shore and in natural areas
- Structural improvements, such as additions, new buildings, residences, garages, gazebos, sheds, decks and patios
- Land swap, division, or combination

# VILLAGE PARKS

#### Parks General Information

The Village of Summit owns and maintains four parks that offer a variety of amenities for Village residents and visitors to enjoy. Village parks are open by ordinance from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Park restrooms and facilities are open from April 15 through October 15 each year, depending on weather. Pets are allowed in Village Parks and must be kept on a leash at all times.

# POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Village of Summit maintains a police presence 24 hours/day, 365 days/year to protect and serve the Village residents and visitors to the community. During the summer months, the police department maintains a boat patrol on all major lakes. To safely dispose of old or unwanted medications, there is a drug drop box located in the Police Department Lobby.

Hours: Monday – Friday 7 a.m. – 3 p.m.

#### EMERGENCY VESTIBULE

A secure vestibule is open 24/7 for any person in distress to access. The vestibule has a doorbell inside that rings directly to dispatch and a lockdown button that immediately locks the door so no one else can enter the vestibule. The person can leave on their own once they feel safe or wait for an officer to come assist them.

#### WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

There is NO parking on the Village Right-of-Way November 1 – April 1 regardless of weather conditions.

#### OUTDOOR BURNING

Outdoor burning of dry leaves and yard waste is allowed; the fire and resulting smoke must be supervised by an adult at all times. Campfires are allowed in a designated area with a flame not exceeding four feet in height.

## SCAM ALERT

There continues to be a variety of scams that target our citizens. You can find information on different scams at: https://www.consumer.ftc.gov/features/scam-alerts The following tactics are sure to be related to a scam:

- Threatening arrest if payment isn't made
- Requesting you to send/wire money
- Over-refunding money and then asking you to send back a portion
- Requesting payment via gift cards
- Threatening that you will be arrested if you contact the police or hang up on them
- Individuals you have never met in person asking for money (internet romance scams)
- Asking you to verify personal information when they called you with a "problem" If anyone contacts you and engages in these tactics, you should end the contact. If in doubt, call the Summit Police Department before doing anything the person requests, no matter what they threaten over the phone.
