CONGRATULATIONS TO RAMM & JEE FOODS!

The Butler County Board of Commissioners has allocated American Rescue Plan Act/State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (ARPA/SLFRF) to each township in Butler County to be used for disparate populations within the respective community and to mitigate the needs of the underserved. During the Ross Township Board of Trustees meeting on March 21, 2024, the Board authorized two projects to receive this ARPA/SLFRF Local Community Allocation Plan.

Ross and Morgan Ministries of Butler County (RAMM) has been awarded a total of \$75,000 to provide food and financial assistance for rent, utilities, etc. to families, for food van maintenance and repairs and food pantry physical upgrades. OUTDOOR WARNING SIRENS

As per the Butler County Sheriff's Office, the function of the outdoor warning siren is to alert residents to seek shelter and/or to go indoors and turn on the radio and/or TV to become informed. Major uses of the sirens within Butler County are under the following conditions:

- The issuance of a tornado warning by the National Weather Service (NWS).
- An impending enemy attack.
- A chemical emergency in progress.

Ross Township has 3 outdoor warning sirens, which are located on Black Rd., Layhigh Rd. and Mikehill Dr. The outdoor warning sirens are tested on the first Wednesday of each month,

at 12:00 noon. The tests are not conducted when there is the possibility of severe weather on that day.

To ensure that you receive the most timely and current severe weather information, utilize a tone-alerting weather radio that will receive severe weather watches and warnings broadcasted directly from the National Weather Service (NWS) over the NOAA weather radio broadcast system. To best protect yourself, indoor warning tone-alerting weather radios augment the outdoor Butler County sirens to give you an integrated indoor and outdoor warning system.

RUMPKE LARGE ITEM COLLECTION

Did you know that Rumpke will collect one large item from residents each month for both full and limited service plans? Large item collection will occur on your scheduled collection day during the first full week of service each month. Large items include any items too large to fit inside a standard trash bag or trash can like furniture or appliances. Mattresses, box springs and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic prior to collection. Together, one mattress and one box spring are considered one large item.

- Rumpke will not accept bags or cans filled with rocks, dirt or construction debris.
- According to Federal Law, Rumpke is not permitted to accept batteries, tires, liquids, combustible materials or any items identified as hazardous.
- Freon must be properly removed from appliances prior to disposal.

ROSS RESIDENTS CAN NOW RECYCLE MORE WITH HEFTY RENEW PROGRAM

Rumpke continues to grow the list of items accepted in its recycling programs and has partnered with Hefty to allow customers to recycle even more material.

Residents can recycle even more plastic material than the traditional bottles, jugs, tubs and cups, by purchasing Hefty ReNew bags from local retailers (now available at Kroger, Meijer, Walmart, Target, Menards or Ace Hardware stores). Fill these durable, orange bags with hard-to-recycle plastics like plastic bags, plastic party cups, plastic cutlery, film plastic and Styrofoam. Tie the bag shut and place inside your recycling container. Rumpke will take care of the rest.

As a reminder, only the items accepted in the Hefty ReNew program should be enclosed in a plastic bag. All other recyclables should continue to be placed loose in recycling carts. For more information on what you can recycle, visit www.rumpke.com.
