How does the Land Use and Resource Management Department learn about zoning violation?

- Anonymous complaints Frustration with anonymous complaints
- Neighbors
- Business competitors
- Township
- City or Village
- Conditional Use Follow Up
- Other on-site or drive by inspection



How do we achieve compliance?

- Most often first contact simple phone call
- Letter
- Violation Letter
- Citation
- Stop Work Order
- Long Form Complaint



What can my township do to address complaints?

- Call our Office
- Do we have jurisdiction? We do not regulate garbage or weeds.
- Speak to your zoning officer
- We do not "play favorites" or have a "naughty/nice list".
- We have been short handed just hired a new zoning officer today
- Lindsey Smith is coming back part time to help on Fridays

Why do these cases take so long???

1963: 10 acres of this parcel is rezoned from "Agricultural" district to

"General Business" district.

August 13, 1974: County adopts a new zoning ordinance. This entire parcel is zoned

A-1, prime agricultural land district.

March 8, 1976: Document # 00990 is recorded at Register of Deeds Office.

Document is a land contract transferring the 40 acre parcel to

William Wendeberg from Robert G. Knopp.

July 20, 1976: Note in the file indicates that a farm implement dealership on the

property was made non-conforming in 1974. Note indicates it

could be zoned A-4. All zoning maps since the original adopted

A-1 show approximately 2 acres of A-4 zoning in the area that was

being utilized around the buildings by anything other than

cropland. No official rezone file found.



Why do these cases take so long???

May 7, 1986:

County Zoning Officer, Carol R. Meadows sent Mr. Wendeberg a certified letter notifying him that he is in violation of the permitted uses of the A-4 zone district.

May 23, 1986:

Carol Meadows sent a letter to Jim Van Dreser from the Town of Walworth summarizing the situation.



Why do these cases take so long???

October 17, 2002:

County Zoning Officer, Nancy Welch sent a violation notice letter to Mr. Wendeberg stating that he had a junk/scrap/automobile salvage yard on the property.

October 28, 2002:

Nancy met with owner and gave him until July 1 to clean it up as long as continued improvement was being made.



January 20, 2003: Nancy sent letter requiring more progress.

Jan-Apri, 2003: LURM is provided receipts proving items are being scrapped.

April 26&28, 2003: LURM received a letter explaining that Mr. Wendeberg has had a heart attack and will have to adjust his pace.

May & June, 2003: LURM is provided more scrap receipts.

November 20, 2003: Nancy finds the property to still be out of compliance and issues a citation for four violations. (\$1188.00)



January 2004:

Matter is scheduled for a court trial.

February 5, 2004:

County Zoning Officer, Nancy Welch and County Planner, Matt Weidensee met with Mr. Wendeberg and Attorney Rasmussen on site. They identified the A-4 area of the property. All items unrelated to a farm implement dealership must be removed and all related items need to be contained in the A-4 area.

April 2004:

Stipulation and Order entered into.

November 24, 2004: Nick Sigmund sent a Letter to Lee Huempfner regarding continued noncompliance.



March 2, 2018:

Nick Sigmund, Michael Cotter, and Shannon Haydin do an inspection. Nick Sigmund took photos. Nick Sigmund issued four citations.

April 4, 2018:

Mr. Wendeberg requests a trial.

July 30, 2018:

Trial takes place. Mr. Wendeberg is found guilty of all four violations.

September 25, 2018: Mr. Wendeberg came into the office and indicated he has been cleaning up the site. He thought he may be ready for an inspection by mid October. He also provided a petition indicating that he is serving a vital service of salvaging for recycling and reuse.
