## RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD PROPOSING TO EXCEED LEVY LIMIT VIA TOWN MEETING

## Town of Woodville, Calumet County Resolution No. 10-2024A

Whereas, the State of Wisconsin has imposed levy limits on town, village, city, and county levies for 2024 and thereafter under Wis. Stat. § 66.0602;

Whereas, Wis. Stat. § 66.0602 limits the allowable local levy for 2024 to a percentage increase of no more than the greater of (a) zero percent of the 2023 payable 2024 adjusted actual levy as calculated under the state's levy limit law* or (b) a percentage equal to the percent change in equalized value due to net new construction less improvements removed, which for the Town of Woodville is 0.967 % (Net new construction % from LLW Line 6);
Whereas, the town board of the <u>Town of Woodville</u> , <u>Calumet County</u> , believes that for the 2024 tax levy (to be collected in 2025) it is in the town's best interest to exceed the state levy limit as described above by a greater percentage than <u>0.967</u> <u>%</u> (Net new construction % from LLW Line 6);
Whereas, the Town of Woodville's 2023 payable 2024 adjusted actual tax levy was \$ 287,050.00 (LLW Line 4), and further whereas the state law would limit this year's increase to \$ 2,775.77 (LLW Line 4 x Net new construction % from LLW Line 6), for a total allowable town tax levy after adjustments for 2024 (to be collected in 2025) of \$ 287,940.00 (LLW Line 10)**;
THEREFORE, the town board of the <u>Town of Woodville</u> , <u>Calumet County</u> does hereby resolve and order as follows:
<ol> <li>The town board supports an increase in the town tax levy for 2024 that will exceed the amount allowed by the state levy limit.</li> </ol>
2. The town board directs that the question of increasing the allowable town tax levy for 2024 (to be collected in 2025) by 69 % (Dollar amount of requested levy increase ÷ LLW Line 10 amount x 100), which would increase the town levy by \$ 198,678.00 (Dollar amount of requested levy increase), for a total tax levy (after adjustments) of \$ 486619.00 (Dollar amount of requested levy increase + add LLW Line 10) shall be placed on the agenda for the special town meeting to be held on _November 6, 2024.

The town board directs that the question of increasing the allowable town tax levy for 2024 (to be collected in 2025) by 69 % (Dollar amount of requested levy increase ÷ LLW Line 10 amount x 100), which would increase the town levy by \$ 198,678.60 (Dollar amount of requested levy increase), for a total tax levy (after adjustments) of \$ 485,728.60 (Dollar amount of requested levy increase + add LLW Line 10) shall be placed on the agenda for the special town meeting to be held on _October 31, 2024.
