NATURAL GAS

In 2018 the Utah legislature passed House Bill 422, which allowed Dominion Energy to obtain funds to expand natural gas services into unserved rural areas. The first round of funding became available in 2021 and Eureka and Goshen were chosen by Dominion Energy as the first two expansion projects. The Eureka project is completed, and the Goshen project is currently underway. The first round of funding has been fully committed to projects. The next round of funding is available in 2023.

The town council has been in contact with Dominion Energy in effort to have natural gas brought into town. There are five communities currently on Dominion Energy's list for the next round of funding and Genola is on the list. Dominion Energy will not make a decision about which communities it will bring natural gas to until early 2023. Here are some of the criteria it will use to make its decision.

Dominion Energy will look at the cost of installation versus the profitability of providing the service. Goshen and Eureka scored high on this criterion, in both communities' lot sizes are small and homes are close together. Because Genola lots are large and homes are spread out, the cost of installation is very high, and the profitability is low. Another impediment for expansion into Genola is the gas line would need to cross wetlands to bring the pipeline from Goshen into Genola. Wetlands present environmental as well as installation challenges, both of which Dominion Energy tries to avoid. There is one major compensating factor in favor of Genola being chosen; Dominion Energy would benefit by linking its gas line in Goshen with its gas line in Santaquin, which would bring gas through our community. The town council is committed to doing everything it can to bring natural gas to

Genola. The council is communicating periodically with Dominion Energy to help answer questions and to ensure that Dominion Energy's analysis of expansion into Genola is as favorable as possible. The council is hopeful that this effort will be successful.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

We will have some fun things for the kids to do also we hope to see you all there.

BUILDING PERMITS

Many people have questions about when a building permit is needed. Any structure or addition over 200 square feet will require a building permit. All applications are available on the town's website. The two major steps are having the site plan (map of everything on the property including proposed structure) approved through the planning commission and the building plans approved by the building inspector. If you have any other questions regarding the permitting process or where to start, please contact the town office and we would be happy to help you.
