ALL DOGS MUST BE LICENSED BY APRIL 1: ALL DOGS MUST HAVE A LICENSE AND BE CONFINED TO THE OWNER'S PROPERTY. Owners of dogs found harassing pedestrians, livestock, etc. will be fined. All livestock must be confined to owner's property. Dog license are valid from January 1 to December 31. LICENSE RATES ARE: Male \$8.50 Neutered Male \$3.50 Female \$8.50 Spayed Female \$3.50 ANYONE THAT HAS 4 OR MORE DOGS IS REQUIRED TO PURCHASE A KENNEL LICENSE OR MULTIPLE DOG LICENSES Multiple Dog License (Up to 12) \$36.50 Owners must present their RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE showing that their dog is vaccinated against rabies by a veterinarian before the dog can be licensed. Jeanne will also need a PHONE NUMBER from each owner for the dog license report sent to the Brown County Clerks Office. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED!!!!
