New Fire Truck delivered in 2025

Members of the Town of Oshkosh Volunteer Fire Department received their highly equipped new ride in April of 2025 serving our community. FEATURES ARE:

- Seating for seven firefighters verses the old truck with seating for three puts more firefighters on scene to complete tasks needed.
- 1500 gallons per minute pump verses the old truck which was 1250 gallons per minute.
- New is a rear intake to draft water. This option allows placement of a portable water tank at the rear of the truck to keep one lane open allowing space for traffic flow, if necessary, on narrow roadways.
- More compartment space allows for a second-set of Jaws of Life was placed on the new engine.

Protect the Waterways

Stormwater Management

Healthy Yards . . . Healthy Lakes and Streams

What we do in our yards can directly affect our lakes and streams. Before using fertilizer on your lawn or gardens, test your soil. A \$15 soil test will show if your soil is lacking anything so that you don't waste your money on something you don't even need. Instructions and forms from the UW Soil and Plant Analysis Lab are online at <http://uwlab.soils.wisc.edu/madison/>. Results will tell you exactly what you need for healthy lawn and gardens.

If your test shows you do indeed need fertilizer, be sure to clean up any that lands on your sidewalk, driveway or other hard surfaces. If left on paved areas, it can easily make its way to the nearest lake or stream with the next rainfall. Keeping leaves, grass clippings and other yard waste, which contain nitrogen and phosphorus, out of the street also help prevent lakes and streams from becoming green and scummy. When these nutrients wash into lakes and streams they can promote nasty algae blooms and excessive weed growth (which can lower oxygen levels in the water) and may release ammonia (toxic to fish).

Healthy yards add to the beauty and value of your home. They can also help our lakes and streams by allowing rainwater to soak into the soil rather than running off to the nearest storm drain. So, do your part and keep your lakes and streams

Make a Difference—Plant a Rain Garden

Rain gardens (shallow depressions planted with native wildflowers) soak up rainwater or melted snow from your rooftop, driveway and lawn. They are positioned to collect water from downspouts or at a low-point in the yard where drainage naturally occurs. The gardens allow water to soak into the soil rather than running off to the nearest lake or stream.

A rain garden can soak up to 30% more water than a traditional lawn. Why is that important? Because the water from rain and snow that runs off our roofs and driveways to the streets and through the storm drain system to our lakes carries with it all sorts of pollutants like fertilizers, oil, pet waste and more. Whatever is in the street—garbage, pet waste, oil, etc.—gets washed to the nearest lake or stream.

Mature rain gardens are delightfully easy to maintain. Once plants get established, very little weeding is needed—far less time consuming than mowing the lawn. Just think—no noise, no gas, and all that free time!

Besides helping our lakes and streams, rain gardens are aesthetically pleasing and provide habitat for birds, butterflies and beneficial insects—including dragonflies that eat mosquitoes. You can make a big difference by devoting a small amount of space, time and money to the creation of a rain garden.

Other Reminders...

- ⇒ CONCRETE is NEVER allowed in the road right-of-way/ driveway approaches.
- ⇒ Permit is required for new installation and replacements of a driveway culvert.
- ⇒ Disposal of unused items like rubbish, or yard waste in town ditches and road right-of-way is prohibited. Violators may be fined and charged for removal costs.
- ⇒ Permit is required for any disturbance of road right-of-way/ ditches.

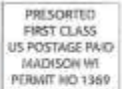
Home/building address numbers MUST be clearly marked and visible from the road. Our first responders want to find your location quickly if there is a *medical emergency*.

As required under the Wisconsin State Statutes, owners of dogs in the Town of Oshkosh must have rabies vaccination and be licensed.

Vaccination against rabies of all dogs by a veterinarian is required within 30-days after the dog reaches 5-months of age and revaccinated within one-year after the initial vaccination. If the owner obtains the dog or brings the dog into this state after the dog has reached 5-months of age, the owner shall have the dog vaccinated against rabies within 30-days after the dog is obtained or brought into the state unless the dog has been vaccinated as evidenced by a current certificate of rabies vaccination from this state or another state. Older vaccinated dogs must be revaccinated before the certificate expires or within three-years of the previous vaccination. Certificates of current vaccination by a veterinarian must be presented when obtaining dog licenses.

The license fee for neutered males or spayed females is \$3.00, upon presentation of evidence that the dog has been neutered or spayed, and \$8.00 for not neutered male or not spayed female dogs.

Dogs that become 5-months of age after July 1st will be assess at 50% of the regular license fee.
New residents of the town have 30-days to obtain a dog license.

Penalties

A late fee of \$5.00 shall be added to the owner of each dog 5-months of age or who fails to obtain and renew his or her dog license after April 1st or after required deadline. An owner who fails to meet the dog licensing requirement by statute may be required to forfeit no less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00.
