

ORDINANCE NO. 29

PUBLIC PEACE AND GOOD ORDER ORDINANCE

The Village Board of the Village of Marquette do ordain as follows:

Section 1. OBSTRUCTING STREETS AND SIDEWALKS PROHIBITED.  
No person shall stand, sit, loaf or loiter or engage in any sport or exercise on any public street, sidewalk, bridge or public ground within the Village in such manner as to prevent or obstruct the free passage of pedestrian or vehicular traffic thereon or to prevent or hinder free ingress or egress to or from any place of business or amusement, church, public hall or meeting place.

Section 2. LOUD AND UNNECESSARY NOISE PROHIBITED.  
(1) No person shall make or cause to be made any loud, disturbing or unnecessary sounds or noises such as may tend to annoy or disturb another in or about any public street, alley or park or any private residence.

(2) Operation of motor vehicles. It shall be a violation of this section for a person to operate a motor vehicle so as to cause the tires thereof to squeal, the horn to blow excessively or the motor to race excessively.

Section 3. LOITERING PROHIBITED. (1) LOITERING FOR IMPROPER PURPOSES. No person shall loiter or lounge in any public street or highway or alley or in any other public place or on any private premises without invitation from the owner or occupant thereof for any immoral, illegal or improper purpose or insult or disturb any person by any act, gesture or language.

(2) Obstruction of highway by loitering. No person shall obstruct any street, bridge, sidewalk or crossing by lounging or loitering in or upon the same after being requested to move on by any police officer.

(3) Obstruction of traffic by loitering. No person shall loaf or loiter in groups or crowds upon the public streets, alleys, sidewalks, street crossings, or bridges or in any other public places within the Village in such manner as to prevent, interfere with, or obstruct the ordinary free use of said public streets, sidewalks, streets, street crossings, and bridges or other public places by persons passing along and over the same.

(4) Loitering after being requested to move. No person shall loaf or loiter in groups or crowds upon the public streets, sidewalks, or adjacent doorways or entrances, street crossings or bridges or in any other public place or on any private premises.

Section 4. PENALTIES. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance, shall upon conviction there-  
fore forfeit not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$200.00  
and the costs of prosecution and in default of payment  
of such forfeiture and costs shall be imprisoned in the  
county jail until payment of such forfeiture and the costs  
of prosecution, but not exceeding thirty days for each  
violation. Each day of violation shall constitute a  
separate offense.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect Nov.  
26<sup>th</sup>, 1974, after the passage and publication  
according to law.
