

VILLAGE ORDINANCE REGULATING LITTER IN THE  
VILLAGE OF MARQUETTE.

An ordinance regulating and providing for penalties for the Violation of its Provisions regarding the throwing of Litter and Refuge on to the Streets of the Village of Marquette.

Be it Ordained by the Village board of the Village of Marquette, Green Lake County, Wisconsin.

Section I Definition: For the purpose of this Ordinance the term "Litter" or "Refuge" shall mean all waste material, trash, papers, cans, bottles, boxes, cartons, etc.

Each and every person shall not throw litter and refuge on the streets of the Village of Marquette; this shall include each and every street, road, alley, or public lands.

The President of the Village of Marquette shall cause to be posted in at least 3 conspicuous places in his municipality permanent signs notifying that every person is required by law not to throw litter and refuge on the streets and roads of Marquette.

The Village Marshall or any officer of the County of Green Lake shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.

ANY PERSON, FIRM, OR CORPORATION violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 and each violation shall constitute a separate offense.

If any Section, paragraph, clause, or sentence of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction such holding shall not affect the remaining Sections, paragraphs, clauses, and sentences.
