

ORDINANCE NO. 60

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE NUMBER OF ELECTION OFFICIALS
AT THE POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY

WHEREAS, the Village of Marquette population is under 200 people of voting age and has historically had a low voter turn out for specific elections.

WHEREAS, the expense of hiring election officials or 'poll workers' for low turn out elections causes a burden on taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Marquette, Green Lake County, Wisconsin, in session duly begun on the 12th day of September, 2011, does ordain as follows:

1. The number of election officials shall be no more than five and no less than three, pursuant to Wis Statute 7.30 (1) (a) & (b).
2. The decision for the number of election officials to be hired for each election shall be at the sole discretion of the Municipal Clerk, to adequately staff a specific election as needed. The poll workers can be hired to work all day or use split shifts.

This ordinance shall take effect sixty days after passage.
