UPDATE ON VILLAGE PROJECTS

The Village is concluding a very busy summer in terms of projects. The Village was able to repave a section of Elm and Oak Streets. Aspen and Apple Streets received a one and a half inch thin overlay of pavement to help maintain the condition of these streets. The crew rebuilt several manholes and catch basins throughout the Village.

Our search for a new well over the past several years has



finally panned out. We found a potential site that can produce up to 300 gallons of water per minute. The next step is to test treatment systems to ensure that we can provide quality water from that well. This testing should occur this fall. While we are still in the testing process with the well, things are looking promising.

Finally, the Graupner III Subdivision is almost complete and several lots have been sold. Construction has started on one duplex that is being developed for senior housing. At least four more single family houses will be going up next year.

The 2021 brick reveal ceremony will be held on Saturday, October 16th beginning at 10am at the Veterans Memorial Park in Spencer. Bricks that were purchased since last fall will be revealed. The park is on the corner of Highways 13 and 98.

KEEP WATER READ BUTTONS CLEAR

Somewhere, on your house, you will find a button that looks like this. Please remember to keep a clear path to



this button for the meter reader. Snow should be cleared to allow easy access also. If a fence, porch or other item causes access to be a problem, contact the Village Office to discuss options to move your button.

LEAF PICK-UP

Leaf pick-up will be done by Whirlwind this year. They will routinely swing around and vacuum up the leaves that are left curbside. As you have leaves, place them on the edge of your lawn. Do not put them in the gutters as they clog up the storm sewer drains.




PRESIDENT'S CORNER

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL CODE 418-10

The owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot which fronts any sidewalk shall keep said sidewalk clear of all snow and ice...sidewalks shall be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 36 hours if your lot is located in a commercial or institutional zoning district and 72 hours if your lot is in a residential district from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear of snow and ice to a minimum of four

feet in width. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the parcel or lot...shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or



salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians...

Failure to comply with the above requirements will cause the Village to clean any walk, without prior notice, that is not cleared and bill the responsible landowner.

WINTER PARKING - CODE 451-23

No person shall park any vehicle on any street in the Village of Spencer between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the period from November 1 through April 1.

ELECTION INSPECTORS WANTED

Every election requires staffing from the Village's Election Inspectors. Every time you vote, you have an opportunity



to see these inspectors in action. These people are on the front line making sure that Wisconsin Election Laws are followed and that each eligible voter can legally cast their ballot. During elections with smaller turn outs, we

staff with three to five and during larger elections we staff with seven. The Village is looking for more inspectors for the 3 or 4 elections that we will be having in 2022. GRASS AND OTHER ITEMS IN STREETS

Blowing lawn clippings into the street is against our Village Ordinances. Grass clippings blown into the street end up in

catch basins reducing the ability for storm water to properly flow. This can increase yard flooding, since yard drains also connect to the system. Once grass clippings enter into our storm water system, they can



cause storm water backups that can cause damage to your property. Please be mindful when you mow to prevent grass from getting into the street.

As mentioned in the Leaf Pick-Up article, leaves need to be left on the edge of your lawn, not in the street, for the same reasons as stated above.

NO WIPES DOWN THE PIPES!

EVEN IF A PRODUCT SAYS IT IS "FLUSHABLE" IT IS NOT.

UNLESS IT IS TOILET PAPER, IT SHOULD NOT BE FLUSHED!

Do not flush diapers, disposable wipes, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, and facial tissues.

Putting these items down toilets may plug sewers and cause raw sewage to back up into YOUR HOME.

DOG ORDINANCES

Remember to get your dog(s) licensed! Dog Licenses are due annually and valid January - December. Bring your rabies vaccination certificate to the Village Office. The charge is \$5 for dogs that are spayed or neutered or \$10 if they are not. THIS IS A STATE LAW!!

Ordinance 172-13 Section C Limitation on number of dogs and cats.

(1) No family shall own, harbor or keep in its possession more than two dogs and two cats in any residential unit without the prior



approval of the Village Board, except that a litter of pups or kittens or a portion of a litter may be kept for not more than twelve weeks from birth.

(2) The above requirement may be waived with the approval of the Village Board when a kennel license has been issued by the Village pursuant to §172-3B. Such application for waiver shall first be made to the Village Administrator-Clerk/Treasurer. If the Board approves an exception to this chapter, the petitioner will pay an extra fee of \$50 per license for each dog, each year they exceed this chapter.

In case of a new resident moving to the Village who has more than two dogs, the new resident must apply for a permit to allow a third dog. The number of dogs will be reduced to the two allowed by ordinance once the 3rd dog is no longer in the house. For more information, contact the Village Office.

Ordinance 172-5 Section E Restrictions on keeping of dogs, cats, fowl and other animals.

Keeping of dogs. All parties who own, keep, or harbor dogs within the Village of Spencer must be in full compliance with the following conditions:

Containment. All dogs must be securely confined indoors or contained either by chaining or fencing.

No dog may be kept on a porch or patio or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit such building on its own violation.

All pens or kennels shall comply with zoning, building and health regulations of the Village.

No person shall permit a dog to go outside its yard, kennel or pen unless the dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than six feet in length when walking the dog on a sidewalk or street.
