2020 CENSUS

The 2020 Census will be this year. It is important that you return your census questionnaire and have your voice counted. Census results help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into states and communities each year. That funding helps every community, no matter the size; no matter the location. Also, the results determine how many seats in Congress each state gets.

In the middle of March, you will receive an invitation to respond online to the 2020 Census. This is the first time that you can respond online to the census. If you don't or can't respond online, you will



receive a paper questionnaire in the mail in the middle of April. Every household will have the option of responding online, by mail, or by phone.

When you respond to the census, your answers are kept anonymous. They are used only to produce statistics. The law is clear, no personal information can be shared.

The US Census Bureau is also hiring in our area. There are many positions available. You can go to www.2020census.gov/jobs to find out more.

DON'T MOVE SNOW INTO THE STREETS



Did you know that dumping or moving snow into the street is illegal under the Village Code? Section 418-14 states that: "It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited, dump, sort, scatter or leave

any... snow (or) ice...in any public street, sidewalk, alley, or upon any public property or upon any property of another, without the express permission of the owner or occupant thereof."

The Village works hard to keep the streets clear of snow. Please help us by NOT moving snow into the street. You will receive a fine if you continue to ignore this ordinance.

2020 ELECTIONS

This year we will be holding 5 elections. February 18th is the primary for the 7th Congressional District and for State Supreme Court. April 7th is the Spencer Village Board, Spencer School Board, and Presidential Preference. May 12th is the Special Election for the 7th Congressional District. August 11th is the Primary and November 3rd is the Presidential Election along with other offices.

To save yourself time at the polls, it will be important to know if your voter registration is up to date. If your voter registration is not up to date because you moved, changed your name, or haven't voted in some time, you will need to stop by the clerk's office to re-register. During busy elections, that can take some time. The easiest way to find out if you are up to date is to check now on myvote.wi.gov.

Click on My Voter Info, enter your name and your birthdate, and it will show you if you are registered and at what address. If you need to update either your name or address, you can do it on



that site. Then, you will need to bring one proof of residency with you to vote (driver's license with correct address, utility bill, bank statement...)

If you haven't registered to vote, you can also use myvote.wi.gov or you can stop in the Village Office and register in person. State law does not allow anyone to register the Monday before the election so don't wait! Finally, remember to bring your photo id to the polls in order to vote.

SEWER RATE CHANGE

On the February 25th water/sewer/garbage/recycle bill, you will be charged a sewer rate. This change affects the minimum charge which will be \$15.99 up to 2,000 gallons (old rate \$14.32) and will be \$9.59 per 1,000 gallons for 2,000 gallons and over (old rate \$8.59). Water, garbage, and recycling rates will remain the same.
