CURBSIDE BRUSH & GARDEN WASTE PICKUP/ CHIPPING GUIDELINES

These guidelines have been prepared in order to efficiently and effectively provide brush pickup/chipping services for residents of the Village of Spencer. This program is intended for the disposal of residential amounts of limbs/branches that are removed during normal maintenance and upkeep only. Brush is not accepted from surrounding areas.

The Village WILL NOT pick up brush from lot clearing activities or from the removal of trees. Contractor-cleared brush or trees will NOT be picked up. It is the contractor's or resident's responsibility to dispose of this. It can be transported to the Village compost facility, or you may check the Yellow Pages under "tree service."

Garden waste must be in CLEAR BAGS only. Colored bags WILL NOT be picked up.

The village crew will answer any questions you have while they are at your residence. If you are unable to speak with the crew, please call the Clerk's Office at 715-659-5423 or the Public Works Department at 715-659-5443 with questions.



SCHEDULE:

 \cdot Brush pickup/chipping will occur on the FIRST and THIRD Monday of the month April -Sept. weather permitting. All brush must be curbside by 7 am on the day of the scheduled chipping or brush pickup. The village crew will not pick up brush in alleys. The crew will not cross or enter private property to pick up brush. Brush that is not curbside by 7 a.m. will not be picked up until the next scheduled pickup date. In order to maintain the schedule, crews WILL NOT return for special pickups.

PILING BRUSH:

These guidelines must be followed. If brush piles do not meet these guidelines, the brush/limbs will not be collected until they meet the guidelines.

 \cdot Brush must be SECURELY bundled – bundles not more than 6 feet long & 6 inches in diameter and no more than 65 pounds. Pile brush/branches with the cut end toward the road, all in the same direction, and pile as loosely as possible so that brush is easy to handle and pick up. Keep brush away from mailboxes, telephone poles, etc.

· Stumps, root balls, roots, rocks, rubbish, construction material, dimensional lumber, or metal WILL NOT be collected.

If there is major storm damage, the village crew will chip brush from storm-damaged trees. The Village Board will determine and announce emergency storm-related brush collections. Attention to these guidelines is greatly appreciated by both residents, neighbors, and the village crew. These guidelines will keep the Village looking great.

SUMMER ORDINANCE REMINDERS

Open Burning is now permitted without a Burn Permit as long as the size of the pile of material to be burned does not exceed four feet in any direction measured horizontally or three feet measured vertically.

Unlawful Dumping on Streets, Chapter 418-14 It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited, dump, sort, scatter or leave any rubbish, stone, wire, earth, ashes, cinders, sawdust, hay, glass, manure, filth, paper, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction waste, garbage or other offensive or noxious material in any public street, sidewalk, alley, or upon any public property or upon any property of another, without the express permission of the owner or occupant thereof.

Regulation of Length of Lawn and Grasses, Chapter 271-5 Public nuisance declared. The Village Board finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on nonagricultural lots or parcels of land, as classified under Chapter 480, Zoning, of the Code of the Village of Spencer, within the Village of Spencer which exceed eight inches in length adversely affect the public health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen and other discomforting bits of plants, constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass, interferes with the public convenience and adversely affects property values of other land within the Village. For that reason, any nonagricultural lawn, grass or weed on a lot or other parcel of land which exceeds eight inches in length is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.



Junk Vehicles, Chapter 456 No disassembled, inoperable, unlicensed, junked or wrecked motor vehicles, truck bodies, tractors, trailers, farm machinery, vehicle parts or tires, or appliances shall be stored upon private residential property or unenclosed within a building upon nonresidential property within the Village of Spencer for a period exceeding 10 days unless it is in connection with an authorized business enterprise located in a properly zoned area maintained in such a manner as to not constitute a public nuisance. NO WIPES DOWN THE PIPES! EVEN IF A PRODUCT SAYS IT IS "FLUSHABLE" IT IS NOT. UNLESS IT IS TOILET PAPER. IT SHOLD NOT BE FLUSHED!

Do not flush diapers, disposable wipes, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, and facial tissues. Putting these items down toilets may plug sewers and cause raw sewage to back up into YOUR HOME.

ORDINANCE 480-69 OUTSIDE STORAGE OF REFUSE; JUNK

No manure, rubbish, inoperable vehicles, salvage material or miscellaneous refuse may be stored within any



may be stored within any residential district when the same may be construed as a menace to the public health or safety or may be held to have a depressing influence upon property values in the area. Junk shall be placed in properly zoned junkyards only.

WHAT TO DO WITH BIG GARBAGE ITEMS

When you have furniture, a mattress, toilets, or other large garbage items to get rid of, you can contact Advanced Disposal at 715-502-3560 to request a pick-up. Construction items and appliances will not be picked up. You may need to get a dumpster for construction items and appliances should be taken to a recycling center such as First Choice Recycling. DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS LAYING IN YOUR YARD OR ON THE CURB! See ordinance 480-69.

NO GRASS IN THE STREET!

Blowing lawn clippings into the street is against our Village Ordinances. Grass clippings blown into the street end up in catch basins reducing the ability for storm water to properly flow. This can increase yard flooding, since yard drains also connect to the system. Once grass clippings enter into our

storm water system, they can cause storm water backups that can cause damage to your property. Please be mindful when you mow to prevent grass from getting into the street.



DOG OWNERS

Remember to get your dog(s) licensed! Bring your rabies vaccination certificate in to the Village Office. The charge is \$5 for dogs that are spayed or neutered or \$10 if they are not.

Ordinance Chapter 172-8 The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter



of such animal to deposit on any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed therefrom by said owner or person in charge. This section shall not apply to a person who is visually or physically

handicapped. Not following this ordinance could result in you receiving a \$124.00 fine.

ALSO - ANIMAL FECES ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BE DUMPED IN THE COMPOST SITE!

Ordinance 172-5 Section E Restrictions on keeping of dogs, cats, fowl and other animals.

Keeping of dogs. All parties who own, keep, or harbor dogs within the Village of Spencer must be in full compliance with the following conditions:

Containment. All dogs must be securely confined indoors or contained either by chaining or fencing.

No dog may be kept on a porch or patio or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit such building on its own violation.

All pens or kennels shall comply with zoning, building and health regulations of the Village.

No person shall permit a dog to go outside its yard, kennel or pen unless the dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than six feet in length when walking the dog on a sidewalk or street.



Any dog that has had a previous incident of animal or human attack must be muzzled when taken on a sidewalk or street.

NEW BUSINESSES IN THE VILLAGE

The Village has seen positive growth of businesses over the past year. USA Mortgage, located at 100 South Pacific St. (the old gas station/Subway on Highway 13 and County Highway C), relocated to Spencer in January of 2020. La Belle Lounge, a new hair salon, moved into 109 North LaSalle St. and opened their doors around March of 2020. Prosthetics Plus is in the process of building a new facility in the Business Park at the end of Cedar St after fire destroyed their previous building. Central Manufacturing, based out of Marshfield, opened a second facility at 1110 South Pacific St., and have recently started operations there. Finally, The Village Market (formerly known as Maranatha Market) opened their doors on February 26th. They are located at 212 South Pacific St. (the old Harn's Furniture).

We welcome these businesses to the Village. Our hope is for their success in Spencer. There have been additional inquiries for space to open other retail shops. The Village looks forward to continuing to see growth.

GRAUPNER III SUBDIVISION A NEW BEGINNING

The Village has begun selling lots in the new subdivision located off of South LaSalle Street. At this time Lots 32, 33, 38-41, 56 and 57 have already been sold. Lots 34-37, 42 and 43 are single family lots, while lots 45-55 are set up for two family and multifamily lots. The buyer of these lots do need to agree to build a 1,500 square foot house for a single family or 1,200 square foot per family on two family housing. Single family houses need to have an assessed value of \$175,000 and two family houses need to have an assessed value of \$280,000, by December 31, 2022. There is still time to purchase and start construction this summer.

Earth Inc. will be back to finish the street grading, site grading, asphalt, and curb and gutter when the street weight limits come off this Spring. Electric, natural gas, and fiber optics will be installed at that time as well. The sites will be ready for your new home or your rental opportunity.
