WHAT'S HAPPENING IN SPENCER

The Village has been seeing a strong amount of growth in the past few years and that will continue this year. Spencer has seen many new businesses locate here and a few have expanded their operations.

As you know, the new Kwik Trip is currently being built. In conjunction with that, the Village will be reconstructing Depot Street. The construction will begin in early May and be done in time for the grand opening.

Also this summer, Eagles Landing West will continue to grow. The developer will be building Roberts Street so that it will connect to Fairhaven Road on the west side of the Village. This will also open up several lots for sale.

Speaking of lots for sale, the Graupner Subdivision is coming along well. Many lots have been sold, and housing is starting to go up. The Village has been working with a housing developer who plans on building several houses over the next two years. The Village has also entered into an agreement with SC Swiderski. They will be building four apartment buildings starting in 2023. These buildings will include a mix of traditional apartments and single level apartments. Lots are still for sale if you know anyone interested.

The Village is also working on building a new park off of Peach Street. The Village Board has been taking their own time and working on clearing out the area over the last two winters. While doing the work, they felt that it would be a nice area for our residents to enjoy. This park will have a short walking trail by the Peach Street Pond and sitting areas to enjoy the natural beauty of that area.

The Village is also progressing on the gun range. After conducting two different studies required by the DNR, the Village is getting the parcel rezoned for recreational use. Earth moving to create berms will occur this summer, and the Spencer High School Shop Class will be building benches. The goal is to have the range open this fall so folks can use it to sight in for deer season. A special thank you goes out to the Spencer Sportsmen Club for a donation of \$40,000 to get this project off the ground.

The Village continues to be committed to our residents to ensure that Spencer is a great place to live, work and play.

CURBSIDE BRUSH & GARDEN WASTE PICKUP/ CHIPPING GUIDELINES

These guidelines have been prepared in order to efficiently and effectively provide brush pickup/chipping services for residents of the Village of Spencer. This program is intended for the disposal of residential amounts of limbs/branches that are removed during normal maintenance and upkeep only. Brush is not accepted from surrounding areas.

The Village WILL NOT pick up brush from lot clearing activities or from the removal of trees. Contractor-cleared brush or trees will NOT be picked up. It is the contractor's or resident's responsibility to dispose of this. It can be transported to the Village compost facility, or you may check the Yellow Pages under "tree service."

Garden waste must be in CLEAR BAGS only. Colored bags WILL NOT be picked up.

The village crew will answer any questions you have while they are at your residence. If you are unable to speak with the crew, please call the Clerk's Office at 715-659-5423 or the Public Works Department at 715-659-5443 with questions.

SCHEDULE:

 \cdot Brush pickup/chipping will occur on the FIRST and THIRD Monday of the month April -Sept. weather permitting. All brush must be curbside by 7 am on the day of the scheduled chipping or brush pickup. The village crew will not pick up brush in alleys. The crew will not cross or enter private property to pick up brush. Brush that is not curbside by 7 a.m. will not be picked up until the next scheduled pickup date. In order to maintain the schedule, crews WILL NOT return for special pickups.

PILING BRUSH:

These guidelines must be followed. If brush piles do not meet these guidelines, the brush/limbs will not be collected until



they meet the guidelines.

 \cdot Brush must be SECURELY bundled – bundles not more than 6 feet long & 6 inches in diameter and no more than 65 pounds. Pile brush/branches with the cut end toward the road, all in the same direction, and pile as loosely as possible so that brush is easy to handle and pick up. Keep brush away from mailboxes, telephone poles, etc.

 \cdot Stumps, root balls, roots, rocks, rubbish, construction material, dimensional lumber, or metal WILL NOT be collected.

If there is major storm damage, the village crew will chip brush from storm-damaged trees. The Village Board will determine and announce emergency storm-related brush collections. Attention to these guidelines is greatly appreciated by both residents, neighbors, and the village crew. These guidelines will keep the Village looking great.

SUMMER ORDINANCE REMINDERS

Campfires are permitted without a Burn Permit but there are regulations. Read Ordinance Chapter 198 for more information.

Unlawful Dumping on Streets, Chapter 418-14 It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited, dump, sort, scatter or leave any rubbish, stone, wire, earth, ashes, cinders, sawdust, hay, glass, manure, filth, paper, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction waste, garbage or other offensive or noxious material in any public street, sidewalk, alley, or upon any public property or upon any property of another, without the express permission of the owner or occupant thereof.

Regulation of Length of Lawn and Grasses, Chapter 271-5 Public nuisance declared. The Village Board finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on nonagricultural lots or parcels of land, as classified under Chapter 480, Zoning, of the Code of the Village of Spencer, within the Village of Spencer which exceed eight inches in length adversely affect the public health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen and other discomforting bits of plants, constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass, interferes with the public convenience and adversely affects property values of other land within the Village. For that reason, any nonagricultural lawn, grass or weed on a lot or other parcel of land which exceeds eight inches in length is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.

Junk Vehicles, Chapter 456 No disassembled, inoperable, unlicensed, junked or wrecked motor vehicles, truck bodies, tractors, trailers, farm machinery, vehicle parts or tires, or appliances shall be stored upon private residential property or unenclosed within a building upon nonresidential property within the Village of Spencer for a period exceeding 10 days unless it is in connection with an authorized business enterprise located in a properly zoned area maintained in such a manner as to



not constitute a public nuisance. See the complete ordinance book online at spencerwi.org for more information.

NO WIPES DOWN THE PIPES! EVEN IF A PRODUCT SAYS IT IS "FLUSHABLE" IT IS NOT. UNLESS IT IS TOILET PAPER. IT SHOULD NOT BE FLUSHED!

Do not flush diapers, disposable wipes, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, or facial tissues. Putting these items down toilets may plug sewers and cause raw sewage to back up into YOUR HOME.

ORDINANCE 480-69 OUTSIDE STORAGE OF REFUSE; JUNK

No manure, rubbish, inoperable vehicles, salvage material or miscellaneous refuse may be stored within any



may be stored within any residential district when the same may be construed as a menace to the public health or safety or may be held to have a depressing influence upon property values in the area. Junk shall be placed in properly zoned junkyards only.

WHAT TO DO WITH BIG GARBAGE ITEMS

When you have furniture, a mattress, toilets, or other large garbage items to get rid of, you can contact Advanced Disposal at 715-502-3560 to request a pick-up. Construction items and appliances will not be picked up. You may need to get a dumpster for construction items and appliances should be taken to a recycling center such as First Choice Recycling. NO GRASS IN THE STREET!

Blowing lawn clippings into the street is against our Village Ordinances. Grass clippings blown into the street end up in catch basins reducing the ability for storm water to properly flow. This can increase yard flooding, since yard drains also connect to the system. Once grass clippings enter into our

storm water system, they can cause storm water backups that can cause damage to your property. Please be mindful when you mow to prevent grass from getting into the street.



DOG OWNERS

Remember to get your dog(s) licensed! Bring your rabies vaccination certificate in to the Village Office. The charge is \$5 for dogs that are spayed or neutered or \$10 if they are not. License are due by April 15th each calendar year.

Ordinance Chapter 172-8 The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter



of such animal to deposit on any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed therefrom by said owner or person in charge. This section shall not apply to a person who is visually or physically

handicapped. Not following this ordinance could result in you receiving a \$124.00 fine.

ALSO - ANIMAL FECES ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BE DUMPED IN THE COMPOST SITE!

Ordinance 172-5 Section E Restrictions on keeping of dogs, cats, fowl and other animals.

Keeping of dogs. All parties who own, keep, or harbor dogs within the Village of Spencer must be in full compliance with the following conditions:

Containment. All dogs must be securely confined indoors or contained either by chaining or fencing.

No dog may be kept on a porch or patio or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit such building on its own volition.

All pens or kennels shall comply with zoning, building and health regulations of the Village.

No person shall permit a dog to go outside its yard, kennel or pen unless the dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than six feet in length when walking the dog on a sidewalk or street.



Any dog that has had a previous incident of animal or human attack must be muzzled when taken on a sidewalk or street.

Village of Spencer Safe Room

In the event of a Tornado Warning issued for the Village of Spencer and the surrounding areas, the Village of Spencer Safe Room is available for anyone needing shelter. The safe shelter is located at:

300 N. School St. Spencer WI 54479 Door #12

Village of Spencer residents are encouraged to purchase a NOAA All Hazard Radio, install a weather alert smartphone app, and/or sign-up for Marathon, Clark or Wood County Code Red Emergency Notification system. When a tornado warning is issued, Door #12 and the interior door to the fitness center will be unlocked. Any individual needing shelter and feel they can safely make it to the facility are welcome to utilize it. The Spencer Fire department will be onsite to serve as the room supervisor and will be able to issue first aid or any other support deemed necessary.

The safe room was designed for a two-hour maximum occupancy duration during a severe weather event; it is not intended and was not designed for long-term sheltering. The onsite supervisor will determine when conditions are good and an all clear will be communicated.

Spencer Community Fitness Center

The Fitness Center membership is available to adult residents of the School District of Spencer, Spencer alumni, current School District of Spencer staff and a member's spouse or significant other (non-students, 18 years and older). Parents of full-time open enrollment students to the School District of Spencer are also eligible. Students of the School District age 15 and older may participate under the direct supervision of a parent or legal guardian.

Applicants must fill out appropriate paperwork, meet our background check requirements (non-sex offender), and show proof of viewing the training/safety video.

At time of approval, a key fob access to the Fitness Center will be distributed at a cost of \$10. Hours of Operation: 5:00 a.m. - 10:30 p.m. Daily (Times may vary depending on needs of the school district.
