

# Cowboys' Hunter Luepke Bullish On Run Game Potential in Oxnard By Adam Schultz

The Dallas Cowboys' <u>run game is perhaps one of the most intriguing battles</u> underway at training camp, and a week into practices in Oxnard, we are no closer to figuring out the pecking order. — — That can both be a good and bad thing, but each player has had their moment in the sun, and we think that regardless of how the final depth chart lands, it won't be a bell cow situation for Brian Schottenheimer, it will be a handful of backs who will be used.

One such player who will have a role to play is Hunter Luepke, and he likes the current dynamic of the room. — — "I think it's a very competitive running back room right now," <u>Luepke said</u>. "With Miles [Sanders], Javonte [Williams], they've had a lot of reps in this league. Jaydon Blue is coming up. He's seeing stuff a little bit different than we might be, but he's also teaching us as well.

We're all just playing off each other, asking each other questions. This is Miles' first time with the fullback, so we've been kind of just playing off each other with how I block things and how he wants me to block them or how I see them. It's just been pretty fun." —— There is no doubt that Sanders and Williams are the top two, but Blue has been rewarded with first-team reps, and he's splashed with his speed and vision being key in making plays.—— Then we have Luepke, who Schottenheimer is over the moon with, as he is playing in a host of positions in camp, which even includes tight end. So, Hunter might have a spot in the offense already sealed; it's just a matter of where he lines up.

The run game is still a little bit of an unknown, but with each player making noise, those roster cuts are going to be a tough gig, and someone who has had a good camp, might see the harsh side of the NFL business.

## Cowboys' Hunter Luepke Content with 'Fun' Training Camp

Dallas Cowboys fullback Hunter Luepke has been making waves in Oxnard with head coach Brian Schottenheimer going out of his way to praise No. 40.--With Hunter used largely as a fullback last year, now, under Schottenheimer, he is being lined up everywhere. --From fullback to running back, tight end, and everything in between, Schotty is putting a lot on Hunter's plate, and through the first week of camp, he's feasting as he looks to get on the field any way he can in Year 3.

But how does he think his camp has gone so far?

"Pretty well," <u>Luepke said</u>. "Getting moved all over the offense, which is pretty fun. So, I just got to stay on top of the installs and, ask as many questions as possible. They always say no questions are dumb questions."——Given how Schottenheimer will want to run the ball, Luepke as a runner, but also a blocker and potential tight end, the possibilities are endless, and it is clear Schotty loves him some Hunter in his offense.———So, it is all about stacking good days of production in Oxnard, which, by all reports, Luepke is doing, and everyone is taking notice. Exactly what his main role will be is unknown, but a jack of all trades type of role might be the best way to describe what Luepke will be doing for the Cowboys

in 2025. - - -Schottenheimer wants his team to be versatile, and you won't find a more versatile player than Hunter, and he's determined to do whatever he can to make the team and get on the field. - -Even if that means playing other offensive positions.

#### Cowboys Scouting Report on Incredible Hunter Luepke In Oxnard

The Dallas Cowboys'

run game has seen many eyes be drawn to it, with Miles Sanders, <u>Javonte Williams</u>, and Jaydon Blue the names people are watching. ——But don't forget about Dallas' ultimate gadget weapon in fullback Hunter Luepke. ——We have seen Hunter's versatility be on show since entering the league, as a fullback, running back, as a receiver out of the backfield, and now under head coach Brian Schottenheimer, as a tight end in their 11 personnel packages.

A typical jack of all trades for Hunter, and during training camp, Schottenheimer has routinely brought up Luepke and what he does for the team. He wears so many hats for the offense, and don't think Schotty doesn't know how valuable that is. ---"Start with the instincts," Schottenheimer said. "Start with the physicality, pad level versatility is incredible. Here's a guy that again idolized Mike Alstott growing up. That's why he wears number 40, but boy, he's very different than Mike. Mike was a great player certainly, but the things that we can do with Hunter, starting because of the versatility, the physicality, so smart, football instincts are off the charts. ---"I think a guy a little bit with a with a chip on his shoulder. He won't say much. He's pretty quiet, but he's got something to prove." --- Given the state of the Dallas offense, we think there is definitely a role for Hunter to play in 2025. Exactly what that is, we aren't sure, but as a runner, receiver, tight end, and nearly anything else you can think of, Luepke is making everyone stand up and take notice.

Having been used sparingly in his first two seasons under Mike McCarthy,

the 2025 season might just be Hunter's breakout year in the NFL.——Because the one thing Schottenheimer likes is some Hunter Luepke in his offense.

#### UDFA ready to carry Dallas Cowboys offense on his back

The <u>Dallas Cowboys</u> ground game has gotten a lot of attention this offseason. Following their struggles to run the ball in 2024, Dallas signed <u>Javonte Williams</u> and <u>Miles Sanders</u> in free agency. They also added two rookies in the 2025 <u>NFL draft</u>, taking <u>Jaydon Blue</u> from Texas in the fifth round and <u>Phil Mafah</u> from Clemson in the seventh.

While all the attention seems to be focused on their new additions, the coaching staff has been spending time working with one of the returning backs, Hunter Luepke. According to The Athletic's Jon Machota, coaching staff has been thoroughly impressed with Luepke, and they're using him at multiple positions. His role has become so versatile that Luepke claims he plays 'everything" on offense, while adding that he will do whatever is asked of him. "Any way I can be on the field, I'm going to try to do it. Whatever they ask me to do, I'm going to do it. ... Coach is trying to be as multiple as possible out there, so I just think me being able to play multiple positions and being able to shift and move around and see different IDs, or go in on pass pro for running backs, run routes with tight ends, the more you can do, the better for this offense. And I think I can do that." - Luepke, via Machota

Undrafted out of North Dakota State in 2023, Luepke has been used sparingly on offense through two seasons. He has just 57 yards and one touchdown on 18 attempts and 129 yards receiving on 15 receptions. — — Despite the small sample size, his versatility stands out every offseason. That said, it appears new head coach Brian Schottenheimer might be willing to put more on his plate in 2025.

members to this district to start the year. When new teachers are brought into the district, we have them participate in a mentoring program. Last year, we revamped our mentoring program. Instead of assigning one-to-one mentors, we have selected a mentor team that will serve as a panel that will help orient and coach the new teachers. In late August, we had our staff in for a four-day in-service. We do this annually to prepare for the upcoming school year. Hats off to the district leadership team for their efforts. It was great to see everyone back in action!

We had a lot of facility work taking place over the summer. We have redone the vast majority of our main hallway floors with an epoxy finish. They look great! The elementary hallways have been repainted. The plan is to paint the other hallways next summer or possibly over extended breaks during the school year. The MS/HS office has been remodeled, and the entryway has been modified to provide a more secure entry process. The retaining wall north of the LTCA was redone. Thanks to a generous donation by Spencer Youth Recreation, we were able to revamp the courtyard that sits in the middle of the elementary school. This will now serve as an outdoor learning space primarily used for students with special needs, but will also be available at times for use by all students. The exterior of the dome was pressure-washed and slated to be repainted. There was an issue with the drip edge that led to water running down the walls and damaging the paint. A long-term solution has been put into place. We also completed the standard roof repairs. Every year, we repair several sections of the roof with the hope of avoiding a major project down the road. Derek Evenson, our Facilities Manager, has done a wonderful job of leading these projects!

Again this year, we planned to have August 27th and 28th serve as our first days of school. We get additional aid from the state on this. While we cannot hold students accountable for truancy regarding attendance on these days, we sure do want to see the students in the building. We are able to get pictures taken and get through a lot of logistics to get the year off to a good start. Many area schools are doing more than two days. We will revisit the topic later on when we are planning next year's calendar.

We are in the process of preparing the annual budget. The annual meeting will be held on September 17th at 6:30 PM in the Distance Learning Center. We invite the community to come in for this meeting. We will

be presenting the preliminary budget. The previously passed recurring referendum will add \$225,000 to the budget. We will also be presenting an update on our strategic planning process. We will discuss our goals around College, Career, & Life Readiness, Health & Wellness, Facility Management & Financial Sustainability, Staff Retention, Recruitment & Development, and Community Engagement & Family Relationships.
