Spencer Pickleball Area Recreational Courts Phase II Dedication By Terry Prust

n Monday Oct. 13th at 1:00 PM SPARC, the Spencer Pickleball Area Recreation Club was honored to recognize those who played a part in the near completion of Phase II of their project. The event started with

a quick review of its start. In mid Aug. of 2022, 6 couples met to discuss the possibility of outdoor courts. By the end of Oct., site selection was completed with the Village along with design/layout plans and grades. Through the donations of material, labor and equipment, the site was stripped and the base course for the asphalt was completed by Nov. 15th 2022. The paving of the courts took place mid-May to mid-June of 2023. SPARC painted temporary white lines and set up the nets; the courts were playable by July 1st. A Grand Opening / Ribbon cutting for Phase I was held on July 14, 2023!

This now brings us to present day Oct 13th at the Phase II Dedication where members of the club were able to personally thank the three Grant Terry addresses onlookers contributors, the Community Foundation of North Central Wis., the Marsh-

field Area Community Foundation Inc. and the Adler Clark Electric Community Commitment Foundation. Along with the area businesses and public supporters: R&R Flooring, Burnett Transit, Partners Bank, Kent Below, Bill & Linda Bauer, Ron & Marcia Draeger, Allen & Gail Jicinsky and Jim & Colleen Bauer.

The contributions of these organizations, businesses and individuals helped cover two major expenses of Phase II--the athletic sealcoating and fencing. Also part of Phase II were benches, a bike rack, a practice wall and a dugout/storage building. Theses items were funded by the fol-

> lowing SPARC fund raisers: Legacy Campaign, Garage Sale, Bake sale, and Brat Frys, many of which had matching fund donations from various club members. As you visit the courts, you find a set of practice paddles and

> balls available to the public. These are maintained and sponsored by SPARC. Many individuals have enjoyed this feature over the past summer.

> During our scheduled club play, the club has extra paddles for anyone wanting to give Pickleball a try.

At the beginning I mentioned nearly completed Phase II. SPARC is in the process of refurbishing and installing the fencing around the outside of the courts.

What's Rockin' in Rocketville

By Jason Gorst Superintendent/School District of Spencer count, we had some positive

news when it came to open enrollment. For years, we have had a deficit when it comes to open enrollment. Last year, we had a deficit of 14 students going out vs coming in. This year, we have reduced that deficit to 7 students. Overall, this is good news for the district. I do want to note that this number will likely change throughout the year as open enrollments are happening at a higher rate overall than in years past throughout the state.

In the October school board meeting, the school board set the local tax levy at an \$8.49 mill rate. This year, there is \$225,000 that was added to our revenue limit, coming from the last operational referendum. There was also a per-pupil increase of \$325 passed by the state. The overall tax levy is going up by an average of 6.63%. This is a much more modest increase than the 16.69% increase last year. This will vary by municipality based on a number of different factors. We were awarded a \$15,000 grant that we were able to apply towards our daycare, which allowed us to reduce the Fund 80 (community service) levy.

For several years, we have had a positive relationship with Bridging Brighter Smiles. This is an organization that comes into our school several times a year to offer dental exams and cleanings for students who are in need of services. Students may qualify for this based on their free and reduced lunch financial status. For more information, please reach out to the school at 715-659-5347.

We are continuing to work hard to maintain and update our facilities. We have repainted the exterior of the dome and added an additional drip edge with the hope of solving the issue of water running down the sides and deteriorating the paint. The football field/track area sound system has been upgraded. We are working on some solutions to some popular tunes and arrange them in a swing style. Gunhild has drainage issues we have coming off the roofs. If you see the baseball amassed a large following online and continues to be a hit everywhere fence down, that is the reason why. It will be back up in time for the spring season. We will be redoing the vast majority of the exterior windows next summer. We were hoping to do this in the summer of 2025, but we tabled the project one more year. We will also be starting a project to re-cable the entire building. Our internet cabling is coming towards the end of its life-cycle, and we will be upgrading to Cat 6A cable.

> This is our first year of offering 4-year-old kindergarten four days per week. We currently have 43 4K students, with 15 of those who are openenrolled into the district. We added a teacher and an aide this year to make this happen. We are hopeful that this move provides a jump start for the little ones and gets them acclimated to the school setting.

> The School Forest Committee ran the Haunted Trail for the 2nd year on October 11th and had a great turnout with nearly 300 people attending. This raised \$1479 to continue to make upgrades on the facilities and grounds at the school forest. We also had a final meeting with the Wis-

consin DNR to approve moving forward with the bidding process for some logging that will take place. We hope that the bidding process will be completed in the next 2-3 months.

And throw in the Cowboys for good measure since they are assuredly still thawing out their heinies after the Ice Bowl on the last day of 1967.



And now I gotta like 'em and heaven forbid, root for them! What's this world coming to? It's all Hunter Luepke's fault. HaHa!! Hunter's doing great again during his third year with the Cowboys and if you read this piece last month you saw he got a nice raise in pay. He scored his 2nd pro touchdown and first TD reception, a nine yarder in a 30-27 loss to the Panthers on Oct. 12.

Hunter has just one carry this season for six yards. He has four receptions for 20 yards and the aforementioned score. He has 3 solo tackles and three assisted. This all begs the question; why isn't he a bigger part of the offense like promised by the last two coaches? Well it's not quite that simple and after a deep dive into that and some film study I hope I have the answer.

First off, did I mention he got paid...lol...always a good start. They don't pay you if you're not an asset. Hunter plays a significant amount of snaps on special teams, an integral part of any football team. And while his carries and targets as a receiver aren't near the top of the list he plays significant snaps, opening holes for a running game ranked 13th in the league with 221.0 yards/game and serves as a blocker and pass protector in a pass offense that ranks 2nd in the league with 268.4 yards/game. Add that all up and the Cowboys have the number 1 offense in the league averaging 390.6 yards/ game after seven weeks. Hunter is a big part of that as a lead blocker/fullback and pass protector for All-Pro QB Dak Prescott.

Conversely, Their defense ranks dead last at 32nd giving up 401.6 yards/game, 260.3 yards through the air and 141.3 rushing yards/game. Perhaps that has something to do with owner/GM/maybe I should hire a real GM, Jerry Jones trading his best defensive player Micah Parsons to the Packers. That's a story for another day. Thanks Jerry and, as always, Go Hunter. Keep it up kid.

WINTER PARKING - CODE 451-23 - -

No person shall park any vehicle on any street in the Village of Spencer between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00



a.m. during the period from November 1 through April 1.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL CODE 418-

10 - - The owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot which fronts any sidewalk shall keep said sidewalk clear of all snow and ice...sidewalks shall be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 36 hours if your lot is located in a commercial or institutional zoning district and 72 hours if your lot is in a residential district from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear of snow and ice to a minimum of four feet in width. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the parcel or lot...shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians.



Failure to comply with the above requirements will cause the Village to clean any walk, without prior notice, that is not cleared and bill the responsible landowner.
