Dog License Increase – – State law requires that all dogs must be licensed yearly (JAN-DEC). You must furnish a rabies vaccination certificate to show proof of vaccina-

tion in order to license your dog. The Village of Spencer Ordinance limits the # of dogs to 2 per household. Marathon County increased the 2026 license fees to:——

SPAYED OR NEUTERED - \$12, MALE OR FEMALE - \$20 - - Puppies - ½ of the above amounts if the dog becomes 5 months after July 1 of the license year. - - Multiple Dog (Kennel) - \$80, Extra tags \$12 each. - - A LATE FEE



OF \$25 will be added on April 1st. — Please see the notice in your tax bill.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE Rates to increase January 1. Waste Management will continue to provide garbage and recycle pick-up in Spencer. Garbage will increase to \$12 per cart and Recycling will



increase to \$6 per cart. This change will be reflected on the bill you receive in February for January use.

The increase in Water and Public Fire rates earlier scheduled for October has been delayed until Well #7 is up and running. It is projected that these rates will also be effective January 1 and reflected on the bill you receive in February.
