Happy New Year from the Village Voice!!
What ya figure 2026 will bring? Let's see!

Global economy: Most forecasts project “sturdy” global GDP growth, with Goldman Sachs Research expecting 2.8%. Growth in the U.S. is projected to be 2.2%-2.6%, while China may moderate to 4.5%-4.8% due to sluggish domestic demand. This resilience is supported by AI investment and proactive policy responses, though a 35% probability of a U.S. and global recession is also noted by J.P. Morgan Global research.

U.S. Economy: The U.S. is expected to see growth, though possibly at a more modest pace than in 2025, potentially around 2.25%. Key factors include the impact of fiscal stimulus from the “One Big Beautiful Bill Act,” which is expected to boost GDP in the first half of the year, and continued high capital expenditure related to AI.

Inflation and Interest Rates: Inflation is expected to remain “sticky” and above central bank targets (likely over 2% and potentially above 3% in the U.S. due to tariffs). This will lead to a gradual approach to interest rate cuts by the Federal Reserve, with several cuts anticipated throughout the year and potentially reaching a target range of 3.0%-3.5% by mid 2026.

Stock Market: Analysts are cautiously optimistic, with consensus estimates projecting an 11% rise for the S&P 500 for the year. While tech remains a dominant theme, performance is expected to broaden into non-AI sectors like financials, healthcare, and utilities.

Labor Market: The labor market is expected to cool but avoid a recession-level collapse, with the unemployment rate potentially rising to around 4.5%. Companies are focusing on efficiency through AI and managing costs, which may limit new hiring.

Equity Markets: A positive outlook for global equities is broadly shared, with forecasts for double-digit gains across developed and emerging markets. The S&P 500 is projected to rise, driven by strong corporate earnings tied to the AI “super-cycle”. However, market concentration in tech stocks is a concern, and a correction of 10-20% is a possibility if earnings disappoint.

Artificial Intelligence (AI): AI is viewed as a key driver of structural economic transformation, boosting production and investment across many sectors, from technology and utilities to healthcare and defense.

Geopolitical fragmentation: Global trade policy is expected to remain a dominant theme, with elevated tariffs and a focus on national security over cost optimization. This could lead to supply chain realignments and increased investment in domestic infrastructure and energy security.

I wasn't even aware of the hip that Hunter played through and he did get a concussion from some friendly fire against the Queens but he bounced right back and didn't miss a game. He has played 49 of 50 games in his third year, proving once again that sometime your best ability is your availability. Tough kid alright. Keep it up Hunter!!!

Luepke (hip) was a limited participant in Wednesday's practice. Jon Machota of the Athletic reports.

Luepke likely picked up the injury during the Cowboys' Week 14 loss to the Lions, when he played 40 snaps (21 on offense, 19 on special teams) and finished with two tackles. His ability to practice in a limited capacity indicates the hip injury isn't a long-term concern and he'll have two more opportunities to log a full practice and avoid an injury designation for Sunday's game against Minnesota

Luepke (hip) was a full participant in Thursday's practice. Jon Machota of the Atlantic Reports. Dec. 11.

Luepke's ability to string consecutive practices together is a great sign for his availability for Sunday's game against the Vikings. The fullback will have one more chance to avoid an injury designation for Sunday and even without a full practice Friday, he seems to be in a good spot to be able to suit up against Minnesota.

Luepke (concussion) is listed as questionable for Sunday's game against the Chargers. Jon Machota of the Athletic reports. Dec. 19.

Luepke was able to practice in full Friday but his questionable tag for Week 16 indicates that he is still in the league's concussion protocol, so he would need to be cleared to play Sunday. If he's not given the green light to play, then the Cowboys may turn to tight ends Brevyn Spann-Ford or Luke Schoonmaker to play some snaps at fullback for Week 16, given that there are no other fullbacks on Dallas' active roster.

Cowboy's Hunter Luepke: Clears concussion protocol. Dec. 21 RotoWire staff.

Luepke (concussion) is active for Sunday's game against the Chargers.

Luepke increased his practice participation over the course of Week 16 prep and he has progressed enough to clear the league's concussion protocol and be available for Sunday's home tilt. The third-year fullback turned five touches into thirty yards during the Cowboy's Week 15 loss to the Vikings before leaving the game after sustaining a concussion. **Editors Note:** Hunter played a significant role, particularly down the stretch, as the Cowboys held off the Commanders 30-23 on Christmas Day. He rushed for 30 yards on 7 carries and caught a pass for 14 yards.
