### What's Rockin' in Rocketville By Jason Gorst Superintendent/School District of Spencer

We have now used up the two "freebie" snow days that are built into our calendar. This means moving forward, any inclement weather days must be a virtual learning day in order for us to comply with hours of instruction mandates at the state level. The school calendar is set to be finalized on the January 28th school board meeting. It will then be posted on our website.

Each year, we must comply with a financial audit of the school district. I am pleased to report that the results of our audit were overall very positive. I appreciate the work our staff puts into making sure we are utilizing funds appropriately and that we are tracking the use of those funds the way the state directs us to. We are currently in our first year of offering 4-year-old kindergarten for full days, four days per week. Overall, things are going very well with this. We currently have 43 students. Of those, 15 are open-enrolled into the district.

We are finding out that we might have to cap open enrollment in this area due to our current staffing model.

For much longer than I have been around, the School District of Spencer has partnered with Burnett Transit. They are a fantastic organization to work with.

Their attention to detail, focus on safety, and commitment to kids are second to none. They are currently experiencing difficulties filling all of their driver positions. The starting pay is \$38 for a route or \$76 per day and \$18 per hour for trips. If you are interested in applying, please call 715-659-4391.

Overall, things are going well with our daycare. We are currently full in our infant care room. We also have an ongoing waiting list. We do, however, have additional staffing needs. We would like to hire more variable-hour workers or substitute daycare workers. If you are interested, please call the school at 715-659-5347 or stop by to pick up an application.

We have ramped up enforcement of our policy of not allowing students to use cell phones in classrooms other than for educational activities. The state has passed legislation that calls for this type of ban to begin by July 1st of 2026. We are currently reviewing our current policy to see if we need to make any updates. We may have to make some tweaks for next year.

I have a few facility updates for everyone. We are still on pace to replace the vast majority of the school's exterior windows this summer. We are utilizing funds that we have saved in Fund 46 to pay for this. We are hopeful that the new windows will make the building more efficient when it comes to heating. We are currently updating all of the internet cabling in our ceilings. We currently have experts working on a plan to address the echo in the dome. We are hopeful to hear more about our options this spring.

Last year, we launched our annual Parent/Guardian and Community Survey. We had a total of 206 responses. We used that information to guide our planning process aligned with our strategic plan. We are again asking parents, guardians, and community members to fill out the survey for 2026. The questions will be the same for the most part, so we can get an apples-to-apples comparison to see how we are growing. We will be adding at least one additional question to the survey. Historically, the District has not used delays or late starts to deal with inclement weather situations. We are curious to see what our parents think about this idea, so we have added a question about that topic. We truly value the feedback, and we are looking forward to hearing from as many people as possible.

2025 Town of Spencer Business of the Year

The Town of Spencer is proud to recognize T&T Quality Cutting as their 2025 Business of the Year. At the town's December 15th board meeting, the Wolf family was presented with a plaque honoring their longstanding dedication and contributions to the town.



Frank Wolf started a hobby sawmill on the family farm in Loyal, WI. In 1958, Frank's son, Norm Wolf, turned the hobby into a full-time sawmill operation on the same property. Following a fire at the original sawmill site in 1990, Ed Wolf, the third-generation sawyer, moved the mill in 1991 to the current location on Karau Avenue in the Town of Spencer. Tony and Travis Wolf joined their father and established T & T Quality Cutting. Eventually, they bought the sawmill from Ed and became fourth-generation owners, where they continue to grow the business even more.

Some Fun Statistics

- Currently, they have 36 employees, with many being family members.
- In 2008, the game changing Hew Saw was installed, which allows them to process a log every 4.5 seconds.
- In 1995, Ed would average 20,000 board feet per day; today, Travis and Tony average over 300,000 board feet daily.
- Currently, T&T Quality Cutting is the second largest sawmill in the state of Wisconsin, sawing over 50 million board feet annually, which is enough lumber to make a walkway 1 foot wide from Spencer to Honolulu and back again.

Our favorite Cowboy just completed his third season with Dallas. It was another good one as Hunter played in all 17 games. He's played in 51 or a possible 52 games in his career thus far, testimony to his grit and toughness. As previously reported, he was a bit day to day a month or so ago while nursing a hip flexor, according to his dad Jon who described it as "thankfully, nothing too serious." All I know about a hip flexor is that I can spell it. And now he has time to rest as the Cowboys missed the playoffs with a record of 7-9-1.

Hunter had 16 carries for 71 yards and a 4.4 yd. average. His longest run was 9 yards and he garnered 6 first downs. His 13 receptions came on 15 targets for 109 yards and an 8.4 average and one touchdown, a long oy 15 yards, 6 first downs and 119 YAC (Yards after catch).
