The elementary school's final assembly of the year was on June 1st to recognize our 3rd Trimester Captains of Character and close out the school year. Congratulations to Elizabeth Fehrenbach, Monty Ledger, Haley Kunze, Karlee Schulz, McKenzie Koenig, Lily Bangart, Korie Hinkelmann, Kameron Moga, and Jasper Berres, who demonstrated extraordinary character throughout the whole school year. A special congrats to both McKenzie and Karlee, who are now 4-time recipients of this recognition! Summer in Rocketville is a different kind of busy than during the school year.

Summer School is also off to a great start. We have approximately 100 students daily, which is up slightly from last year, in our regularly scheduled classes and have a number of additional students in Strength & Performance, Band/Choir lessons, and Volleyball happening throughout the summer. Summer School runs through June 26th.

Derek Evenson has done a great job of leading the charge as our facilities manager. Each classroom, bathroom, and space will be deep-cleaned. Door stoppers are being fixed, locker combinations reset, and small fixes throughout the building are made.

The big project this summer is our windows project. We are working with Nexus and Boson to replace nearly all of our exterior windows (except for the ones in the newer buildings). The new windows will provide an upgrade to our efficiency, which will hopefully cut down on heating costs in the winter. The project is slated to be done sometime in July. The project also includes new sills, screens, and shades. We are paying for the project by utilizing Fund 46 funds that we have saved in preparation for the project. We are also continuing our repainting of interior hallways and other common spaces. Last summer, we repainted the elementary hallways with a school color theme.

We will continue that theme into the other hallways, the old wrestling gym, and the cafeteria. Some of the other summer projects include goal post repairs, concrete repairs, replacing the LTCA circle drive, flooring in Rookie Rockets, flooring in the rest of our hallways, and electrical panel replacements. We will be entering year two of our three-year food service initiative. We saw some solid growth in our parent, community, staff, and student surveys in this area. The main goals were to improve the quality and quantity of food we serve. We are looking forward to

I, Daniel Worsham, am writing my own thoughts freely in the local press, which is also free to publish what it desires. Take some time this July to appreciate the beauty of the United States. All nations have their warts, but gratefulness is good for the heart.

Continuing on a patriotic note, the Marshfield Civic Band will be in town at the Spencer Band Stage, Wednesday, July 8th at 7:30pm! The show is free to the public, just bring a chair or a blanket and enjoy the show. Bob and the band will play patriotic tunes and we'll have some refreshments as provided by the Spencer American Legion Post 298.

You would like another free family event, you say? No problem! Just two weeks later, Wednesday, July 22 at 7:30pm we will host the Central Wisconsin Symphony Orchestra French Horn Choir. This concert is near and dear to my heart. I have been playing horn for 26 years and many of those years at a professional level, my first studio recording was at the age of 11 and my first paid performance at age 13. I then went on a partial scholarship to the University of Minnesota for horn performance, Ski-uh-mah! After graduation I auditioned for orchestras all over the country and the world eventually taking a year position in the Sarajevska Filharmonija in Sarajevo, Bosnia Herzegovina, which is a story in itself. I decided to return to pursue the best thing that ever happened to me, that being Hana (Kramer) Worsham, my lovely and unfailingly patient wife. Later, I was a tenured 2nd horn of the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, 2nd horn of the Beloit Janesville Symphony Orchestra and member of the famed Lakes Area Music Festival in Brainerd Minnesota as well as a frequent substitute musician for the Madison Symphony, Wisconsin Chamber Orchestra, Fox Valley Symphony, LaCrosse Symphony and many others. I say this not to toot my own horn (pun absolutely intended), but rather to say this; of all the players on the stage for this event, ALL of them have had equal amounts of dedication to the arts and to horn playing! Tens of thousands of hours of practice and playing will be on the stage, as around 12 professional horns play arrangements like Jurassic Park Theme (John Williams), Super Man (John Williams), Bohemian Rhapsody (Queen), A Beatles Medley, and the Largo from Dvorak's New Worlds Symphony also known as 'going home.' We will see you soon.

Our leadership team is working on a number of initiatives related to the strategic plan, including but not limited to interventions for students who are struggling, enhancing our academic and career planning, aligning professional development with district goals, community connections, and overall communication. Be on the lookout for our new and improved (and simplified) website that is slated to launch on July 1st. Teachers throughout the district are participating in two flexible PD days over the summer as part of their contract. These days will be used mostly as a focus on curriculum.

We will again start the school year with two "summer school" days on August 26th and 27th. By doing this, we are able to take care of many of the beginning-of-the-year logistics while capturing more state aid for our budget through summer school FTEs. The first day of school will officially be on September 1st. Next year, we are slated to be done before June! This is something I would like to explore doing on a regular basis.

Lastly, I want to give a shout-out to Mrs. Carrie Weisenberger, who is retiring after 31 years in education. Mrs. Weisenberger has been a valuable member of our team for many years. I wish her happiness in retirement!

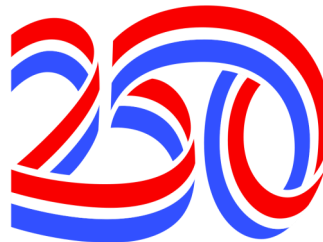
