Ownership of a substantial interest is defined in U.C.A. 17-16a-3(8) as an interest of 10% or more of the shares of a corporation, or a 10% or more ownership interest in other entities, legally or equitably held or owned by the officer or the officer's spouse or children.

**Note: There is no case law or statutory guidance as to what constitutes a business entity "subject to regulation of the Town." A business which is simply issued a business license by the entity may or may not be deemed by a court, administrative agency, an auditor or member of the public to be an entity regulated by the Town. Businesses regulated by interlocal agencies of which the Town is a member may or may not be deemed to be a business regulated by the Town (i.e., a restaurant subject to regulations imposed by an interlocal agency).*

A business entity which requires a conditional use permit to operate may more likely be deemed to be a business entity regulated by the Town than a business that simply receives a business license from the Town.
