

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE MODIFICATION  
OF THE WIDTH OF DUFF STREET,  
GILBERT, ARKANSAS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the Town of Gilbert, Arkansas  
has determined that it is no longer desirable and in the best  
interests of the health, safety, and convenience of the people  
of Gilbert, Arkansas, to retain and maintain the entire length  
of Duff Street at a width of sixty (60) feet; and,

WHEREAS, a portion of Duff Street has in fact heretofore been  
abandoned by the ~~Town~~ of Gilbert and is not maintained by the  
Town nor used as a roadway by its residents;

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Gilbert Town Council that the  
width of Duff Street shall be twenty (20) feet from the north  
side of the intersection of Duff Street and Main Street and  
continue along the remaining distance of Duff Street that runs  
north of Main Street. The twenty (20) feet retained by the Town  
is to be measured from the West boundry of Duff Street. All that  
portion of Duff Street, as previously described, outside of the  
twenty (20) ft. width retained by the Town, is hereby entirely  
abandoned and released to those presently in possession of and  
to those adjoining said street.
