Dear Village Resident:

A few weeks ago, the Mayor and Police Commissioner visited the Nassau County Police Intelligence Headquarters to receive a tour and briefing from senior NCPD officials. During the meeting, a senior official mentioned that Ring has a "Neighbors" information sharing feature that could be used within our Village. In addition, they are encouraging residents to install devices like Ring doorbells or cameras, that record neighborhood activity that can be shared with neighbors and law enforcement agencies should a crime occur. Even if you already have video surveillance systems on your home, adding a ring doorbell or camera might help us share information and video surveillance footage with one another and law enforcement agencies should the need arise. In addition, the Neighbor service can enable us to share useful crime prevention information with our neighbors.

Here is some information provided by Ring. (It should be noted that the devices might be sold at a discount over sale days like Prime Day.) We are offering this information not to endorse a product but to pass along a crime prevention enhancement that that was recommended by the NCPD.

Neighbors is a free app created for residents to connect and share hyper-local safety updates and information from reliable sources. Neighbors Public Safety Service is an interface that allows local public safety agencies to join Neighbors to help keep residents safe and informed.

Neighbors provides local public safety agencies with a feature to help them better engage with and inform the communities they serve. Neighbors is a meeting place for every community member, which includes local public safety agencies. When communities and public safety work together, we believe that safer neighborhoods can become a reality.

How to Join Neighbors For Residents:

Download the Neighbors app for free on <u>iOS</u>, <u>Android</u> and <u>FireOS</u> devices.

You do not need to own a Ring device or any home security system in order to participate on Neighbors.
