# **BECK RETIRES AFTER 50 YEARS**

Beck's career in public service came to a close this past spring when he did not file election papers and retired. Beck is pictured here (from left) with Trustees Russ Kumbier, Doug Webb,

Gary Beck, Jr., Adam Schaefer, Jeff Sterling and Village President Nick Ahlers. Beck served the Village as a Trustee from 2009-2025. Beck served as a Town of Rochester Supervisor from 1975-1995 and as the Town Chairman from 1995 until the town and village consolidated in 2009.

# **LAWN CARE REMINDERS**

It's mowing season, and like most municipalities, the Village of Rochester has ordinances that regulate yard care for public health and safety.

Here are the highlights:

## **GRASS LENGTH**

On parcels under five acres, grass must not exceed **8 inches** in length. Grass and non-noxious weeds longer than this tends to emit pollen, pose a fire hazard, and hide debris, causing safety problems.

If the person in charge of a property fails to cut their lawn, the Village will provide notice of a violation.

If the violation is not addressed, the Village is authorized to cut the lawn, and the cost will be charged to the property owner.

## **NOXIOUS WEEDS**

In accordance with Wisconsin Statute 66.0407, property owners must cut or destroy all noxious

weeds (such as Canada thistle, ragweed, poison ivy, leafy spurge, and field bindweed) before they bear seed or spread to adjoining properties.

## **GRASS CLIPPINGS**

Please keep grass clippings on your own property. Grass clippings may not be blown into the streets, sidewalks, or river or on another person's property.

Clippings in the streets or sidewalks pose safety hazards and can clog the stormwater system.

If your mower leaves grass clippings on the street or sidewalk, use a broom or leaf blower to blow them back into the lawn. Do not use a hose to wash them into the street.

# **OVERNIGHT PARKING**

Overnight parking is prohibited on all streets throughout the Village.

Overnight parking permits are available for three-month periods for some areas. Contact the village at (262) 534-2431 for more information.

For temporary on-street overnight parking, you must notify the Racine County Sheriff's office at (262) 534-5166 ahead of time and for every day that the exception is needed.

# **FIREWORKS**

The Village Board passed an ordinance in 2016 requiring a permit to discharge fireworks in the Village of Rochester.

Permits can be obtained at the Village Clerk-Treasurer's office for a fee of \$15.00. This year, fireworks can only be discharged on **Thursday**, **July 3rd – Saturday**, **July 5 between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 10:30 p.m**.

A separate permit is required for each day fireworks are to be discharged, and permits must be acquired by **June 30th**.

# HONORING THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

In early June Racine County placed two markers in the village at locations verified as part of the Underground Railroad. The Underground Railroad helped runaway slaves reach freedom in the northern United States and Canada before and during the Civil War. The marker at the Rochester Public Library memorializes the Stetson Farm. The farm is located on Maple Road, but the site is unsuitable for a marker due to safety concerns. Another marker commemorates the Ela House on the east side of the Fox River along S. Water Street. The markers are part of the Racine County Underground Railroad Heritage Trail, which consists of 29 different sites. # RULES FOR RECREATIONAL BURNING

Summer means campfire and bonfire season is back, and the village and your Rochester Volunteer Fire Company want to remind you of our ordinances for burning.

Outdoor campfires and small bonfires for cooking, ceremonies or recreation are allowed provided that the fire is confined by a control device or structure such as a barrel, fire ring or fire pit.

Bonfires are allowed only if approved by and in accordance with provisions established by the Fire Chief.

Except for campfires and permitted bonfires, open burning shall only be conducted between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. No one can kindle or start an open fire or a fire in a container between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8 a.m. The fire must be extinguished by 8:00 p.m.



Campfires and permitted bonfires that are strictly for recreational purposes may be kindled or started between 7-11 p.m. and must be extinguished by 1 a.m.

Fire Chief Mike Vos will not allow any burning when the Department of Natural Resources says the fire danger level is "High" or better, or there are sustained winds of 7-10 miles per hour.

Chief Vos also recommends that anyone having a bonfire call the Racine County Sheriff Department's non-emergency dispatch number at (262) 534-5166 and make them aware. Please call the Village Hall at (262) 534-2431 or Rochester Volunteer Fire Company at (262) 534-3444 with any questions.
