ORDINANCE #74

LOW SPEED VEHICLES

The Village Board of the Village of Cochrane, Buffalo County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

- 1. <u>Definitions.</u> For the purpose of this ordinance, Low Speed Vehicle (LSV) shall mean the following:
 - A. A LSV is a self-propelled motor vehicle that conforms to the definition and requirements for LSVs as adopted in the federal motor vehicle safety standards for LSV under 49 CFR 571.3(b) and 571.500.
 - B. The LSV must have a certification label stating that the vehicle meets the above standards.
 - C. LSV's have a top attainable speed of 25 mph, have a gross weight rating of less than 3,000 pounds, and are self-propelled by gas or electric power.
 - D. All-terrain vehicles, homemade vehicles, and golf carts are not considered LSVs.
 - E. LSVs are motor vehicles designed to operate on a street. They have all equipment necessary to be classified as a motor vehicle and as such may only be operated by licensed drivers under all conditions and requirements of standard motor vehicles.
 - F. Low Speed Vehicles are not designed to operate on open highways where speeds are in excess of 35 mph.
- 2. <u>LSV USE</u>. The Village of Cochrane will allow the use of a Low Speed Vehicle within the Village limits under the following conditions:
 - A. LSVs are allowed only on streets or roadways which have a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less.
 - B. The LSV has not been modified from the original manufacturer's condition.
 - C. The operator of an LSV must have a valid driver's license and must follow all traffic laws.
 - D. LSV operators must have a motor vehicle liability policy in effect that covers the LSV and meets minimum required coverage.
 - E. All LSV's must be titled and registered through the DMV.
 - F. The only modifications allowed to a LSV are the replacement of original manufacturer parts or the equivalent and the attachment of lights for night time use.
- 3. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon its passage and publication as provided by law.
