### Garbage Day

A couple of reminders about garbage pickup. Please have your can out by 7 am on Wednesday morning. Put your can at the edge of the asphalt, but not on the road. Also, put your can on the same side of the street as the other cans. If you have two or more cans

together, please be sure that there is at least 10 feet of spacing between each can. If you have more garbage than will easily fit within your can, be sure it is bagged and not spilling out when the can is lifted. Any garbage that spills out is the owner's responsibility to

clean up. Remember to only put household garbage only in your cans. If you are only paying for one can to be picked up, please only place one can out. Otherwise you will be charged for multiple cans. Any questions, please contact us.

## Levan Town Green Dump Reminder

Because Spring and Summer are approaching we thought we all could use this reminder. We accept the following materials for disposal:

Grass clippings, Leaves, brush, branches, garden vegetation, weeds.

Levan town PROHIBITS the dumping of the following items:

Animal Carcasses, Concrete, Con-

struction materials/scraps, Dirt, Metal, Plastic, Brick, Stones, Rocks, Asphalt chunks

#### **Household Garbage**

Please remember that just because you think it is biodegradable does not mean it belongs in the green dump. We are lucky to have this available to us.

If we abuse it, we will lose it.

For other items, please use the

Juab County Landfill located west of Nephi (more information on page 4 about the Juab County landfill).



### Call 811 before you dig!

Levan Town is your Natural Gas distributor. As such, we operate our gas system with an emphasis on safety. We design, operate and maintain our underground natural gas pipeline system in accordance with federal safety standards.

The following are guidelines you as the Natural Gas user need to be aware of: It is the responsibility of the customer to maintain the gas piping downstream from the gas meter (for example, from the gas meter throughout the home or structure). If it is not properly maintained, it may corrode or leak. To insure the lines are safe and reliable, they should be checked periodically. It is recommended that you contact a licensed plumber or heating contractor to assist

you in downstream plumbing beyond the gas meter. If any unsafe conditions are discovered, repair should be made as soon as possible. Levan Town Gas Department can refer you to licensed plumbing and heating contractors, or you can use the Yellow Pages for listings. Should you plan to do any outside digging, Utah law requires that you contact Blue Stakes by calling 811 two days in advance. This is a free service that is used to locate all underground utility services. Please be advised that under state law if you do not call 811, you will be billed by all 3<sup>rd</sup> party entities that are required to be notified in the event of a gas line incident. You can be billed up to \$5,000.00 per party for damage preven-

tion with a maximum civil penalty of \$100,000.00 per excavation. If an excavator fails to provide notice of an excavation, they may be fined an additional \$500.00 along with the previously listed penalties.





### JRDA LANDFILL—for fee paying customers only

construction & Demolition Waste: packaging and rubble resulting from construction, bricks, concrete, soil, asphalt, rock, lumber, pallets, crates, rebar, flooring, carpet, pad, sheet rock, roofing, insulation, windows, siding, fencing, empty buckets or tubes holding less than 10% such as paint, adhesives, solvents, sealers.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE (From Juab County (ONLY): refrigerators, freezers, couches, chairs, bed frames, box springs, mattresses, headboards, drawers, tables, water heaters, stoves, tvs, radios, computers, vcrs, toys, paper, plastic, cardboard, food, tires—4 at a time maximum, foam rubber, metal, electronic components.

PLANT LIFE: Brush, Branches, clippings, leaves, grass, weeds, chips, plants

ALL WASTE MUST BE SEPARATED AND A FEE OF \$3.50 A CUBIC YARD MUST BE

PAID BEFORE DUMPING. OUT OF COUNTY CONTRUCTION and DEOMOLITION
WILL BE CHARGED DOUBLE THE NORMAL
FEES. Plant life will be accepted from occupants of fee paying households of 90 gallon cans without an additional charge.
Commercial tree trimmers and landscapers will be charged \$10.00 per load. NO
OUT OF COUNTY PLANT LIFE ACCEPTED.

RULES: Household, construction & demolition, metal, and plant life MUST BE
SEPARATED and dumped in designated areas. If you have any questions please ask.

NO hazardous waste accepted.

**NO** discharging of firearms.

NO liquids of any kind accepted

**NO** salvaging

**NO** vehicles without title accepted.

**NO** batteries or propane tanks accepted.

**NO** commercial loads accepted on Saturdays.

**LANDFILL FEES** are \$3.50 / Cubic yard or \$10.00 minimum fee. Prices are double if waste originates from out-of-county.

You can purchase a dumping permit from the Juab County Clerk/Auditor or pay with a credit card at the landfill (i.e. Mastercard, Visa, Discover only).

### **Building Permits**

Changes you make to your home or property that involve inspections, electrical, plumbing, property lines (fences), or changes in building footprints are some of the situations that require a Building Permit.

We understand that Levan is a small, rural community and most want little intrusion by government into our lives. Most permits are required for safety concerns. For this reason, we ask that you contact the Town Office before starting your projects to see if a Building Permit is needed. Some permits can be issued right from

the office and some require approval by the Planning Commission. If your permit needs to be approve by the Planning Commission your application should be turned into the office by Thursday the week prior to the Planning Commission meeting. Planning Commission Meetings are the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm.

Levan Town Office hours are 8:30 am to 12:30 pm Monday-Thursday.

#### **BURN PERMIT - JUAB SPECIAL SERVICE FIRE DISTRICT**

Burn permits are required within the Juab Special Service Fire District boundaries which encompasses all of Juab County. Permits must be obtained prior to any open burning by contacting the Utah State Division of Air Quality at: <a href="http://www.airquality.utah.gov/Compliance/OpenBurning/index.htm">http://www.airquality.utah.gov/Compliance/OpenBurning/index.htm</a>, look under Quick Links, then choose the Link for "Open Burn Permit Application", or call: (801) 536-4000. <a href="Please note: it may take up to 14">Please note: it may take up to 14</a> days from the date of request to receive an open burn permit if a hard copy is submitted for processing.

The period from June 1st through October 31st annually is designated as a closed Fire Season by the State of Utah. Burn permits will be issued during this time only in very limited circumstances such as when considered necessary and safe to mitigate fire threat and risk to life or property.

Permits may be issued annually <u>between March 30 and May 30</u> and between September 15 and October 30 only if conditions allow.

#### Permits are issued provided the following conditions are met:

Approved burning allows residents to burn <u>only</u> clippings, bushes, plants, grass, leaves, limbs and other pruning's. State Law (R307-202) prohibits burning of household waste, construction and demolition waste, milled lumber of any kind, cardboard, trash, cloth, rubbish, tires, plastics, chemicals or liquid fuels and petroleum products. Petroleum products <u>may not</u> be used to start fires.

Materials to be burned must be thoroughly dry.

State Law (R307-202) requires the Utah Clearing Index be verified which must be above 500 when burning. The Clearing Index can be obtained by telephone at: 1-801-524-5133 or via the Internet at: <a href="http://www.wrh.noaa.gov/slc/projects/ifp/html/webSMF">http://www.wrh.noaa.gov/slc/projects/ifp/html/webSMF</a> new.php State Law (65A-8-9) requires that you notify your city police department (if they have a dispatch service) or the Sheriff's dispatch at: 435-623-1349 prior to any burning and inform them of your intent to burn. Failure to notify of the burning is a class B misdemeanor and you may be liable for Fire response costs. Notification is required for all agricultural burns.

Burning shall not be conducted within 50 feet of any structure or combustible material. The permittee shall not burn or build a fire in a wind and the permittee shall not burn any brush, grass, or flammable material within fifty (50) feet of any standing forest, brush, grass, or flammable material, unless this permit expressly provides for a lesser distance. Where it is necessary for the protection of public safety or to prevent the spread of such fire, this permit may specify a reasonable distance greater than the aforesaid fifty (50) feet. Other conditions, precautions or stipulations necessary to prevent the spread of such fire may be prescribed below by the fire official issuing this permit.

All flammable vegetation shall be cleared within a 10-foot radius of fire.

Persons burning shall have a garden hose available and connected to a water supply or approved fire extinguishing equipment shall be available during the burning.

Burning material shall be constantly attended by a responsible adult until the fire has been extinguished.

There shall be no burning at night.

When authorized to burn, please be considerate of your neighbors. Be aware of smoke drifting towards and into your neighbors' homes. If the Fire Department is asked to respond, and if it is determined that the fire is a nuisance, the Fire Department will extinguish the fire.

The burning permit does not relieve an individual from personal liability due to neglect or incompetence. Any person burning has a responsibility to establish adequate fire breaks and to take whatever other measures are necessary to insure that the fire is properly controlled. If the fire spreads to another person's property, the person starting the fire shall be responsible for payment of the costs of the suppression action and may also be liable for damages to the other person's property.
