## WINTER PARKING

Sec. 10-1-23 says that no parking is permitted on Town roads between November 1st and April 1st between 11:00 pm and 8:00 am.

## SNOW REMOVAL

It is not permitted to deposit or push snow from a driveway, parking lot, or sidewalk onto a roadway or right-of-way.

## DOG LEASHES

Sec. 7-1-6c prohibits animals from running at large; please remember to keep your dogs on leashes! Even though your dog is the best dog in the world, the dogs they may encounter may not be.

## DITCH MAINTENANCE

Landowners who mow Town Right-of-Way ditches must keep them clear of tall grasses, cattails, and other obstructive vegetation.
