#### ANNUAL TOWN MEETING APRIL 12, 2011

Chairman Eugene Mertz called the 2011 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rantoul to order at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Eight residents and guests were in attendance, along with Board Members Eugene Mertz, David Jannette, Gregg Eickert, Mary Schwartz and Connie Loose. Chairman Mertz verified that meeting notices were published and posted.

The agenda was reviewed. Motion by David Jannette, second by Gregg Eickert to accept the agenda as printed and posted; motion carried by voice vote. A copy follows.

The minutes from the 2010 Annual Meeting, the 2010 Special Town Meeting and the 2010 Special Budget Meeting were next on the agenda. Motion by Wes Hedrich, second by Jeff Wunrow to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the minutes as printed in the 2010 Annual Audit Report mailed to the Town residents with the following change – "water truck" changed to "pumper truck" motion carried by voice vote.

The 2010 Annual Financial Report was discussed. Motion by David Jannette, second by Jeff Wunrow to approve the 2010 Annual Financial Report; motion carried by voice vote.

David Dhein, assessor, sent in the following report:

The 2002 level of assessment according to the Department of Revenue was 99.37%. In 2003 the overall level of assessment went to 94.27%. This means that we were still in compliance. When you fall below 90%, the four-year cycle starts, where the Department of Revenue will require a reassessment. In 2004 we did drop below 90% to 84.51% of market value. For 2007 we were at 79.48%. 2008 was the fourth year out of compliance. In 2009 we had a reassessment of the Town. The assessed value for the Town was at 102.11%. In 2010 the equalized value of the Town is 100.83%. In 2010 we had \$267,300 of new construction.

Motion by Wes Hedrich, second by Robert Durig to designate Collins State Bank, Calumet County Bank-Brillion and State Bank of Chilton as our public depositories; motion carried by voice vote.

Mark Wunrow gave a Road Report. Various roads will be wedged and sealed as the budget permits. Culverts may be replaced. Chairman Mertz thanked Mark Wunrow and crew for the fine job keeping the Town's roads clear this winter.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Jay Olhsen that the Board has short-term (loan to be repaid by the end of the year) borrowing power not to exceed \$50,000.00; motion carried by voice vote.

Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by David Jannette to set the 2012 Annual Meeting for Tuesday, April 10, 2012, at 7:30 p.m.; motion carried by voice vote.

Rob Schoen, Potter Fire Department chief, was present to discuss the purchase of a new water truck. The present truck was placed in service in 1982. NFPA standards are that a truck is replaced in 24-30 years. A new truck could cost up to \$200,000.00. A special Town meeting will be called when the Potter Fire Department has more information regarding this purchase.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Wes Hedrich that the Board has long-term borrowing power not to exceed \$150,000.00; motion carried by voice vote.

The purchase or lease of a Town tractor/mower was discussed. The present tractor/mower is 15-16 years old. A new tractor/mower could cost \$100,000-\$120,000. This possible purchase will be discussed at a special Town meeting when the tractor/mower needs to be replaced.

Wes Hedrich gave a report on the status of the Town zoning ordinance. Paul Birschbach is working on it along with the Plan Commission. The ordinance has been reviewed by an attorney. The suggested changes along with the zoning map will be reviewed by the Plan Commission in April.

A petition has been sent to DATCP to form an Agriculture Enterprise Area in Rantoul, Charlestown, Chilton and Woodville. The Town Board has passed a resolution supporting this endeavor.

Implications of proposed State budget on the Town could include the following: reduced Shared Revenue of \$2,440; reduced Transportation Aids of \$2,915; Town levy frozen at 2010 level - \$245,158.46 or new construction; recycling grant eliminated; possible repeal of Prevailing Wage Law; Employee grievance procedure required.

The possible elimination of the Recycling grant program was discussed. A decision to continue a recycling program at the Town will be placed on a special meeting or the budget hearing/meeting later in 2011.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Mike Wunrow to adjourn; motion carried by voice vote.

#### **November 9, 2011**

The special meeting of the Electors of the Town of Rantoul was called to order by Chairman Eugene Mertz at 7:00 pm at Potter Village Hall. The purpose of this meeting was the Public Hearing and Special Town Meeting on the proposed 2012 Budget. There were twenty-one (21) town residents and the five (5) Town Board members in attendance. Members of the Potter Volunteer Fire Department were also present. Discussion was held on the various budget items.

Chairman Mertz verified that meeting notices were posted and published. Mary Schwartz confirmed that notices were posted on October 25, 2011, published in the Chilton Times-Journal October 20 and 27, 2011, published in the Brillion Lake-to-Lake Shopper November 3, 2011. Postcards noticing the hearing/meeting were sent to Town residents on November 3, 2011.

Rob Schoen, Potter Fire Department chief, made a presentation on the purchase of a new tanker truck. The department is considering a 3,000 gallon 2012 truck for \$162,500. A presentation was also made concerning revising the contract with the Department increasing the annual contract compensation to cover the purchase of a new truck. The Town would no longer purchase trucks with this contract revision. An advisory vote was taken with the following results:

- 2 Purchase new tanker truck for Potter Fire Department. Do not chance the contract.
- 12 Change contract to increase yearly compensation, which would include Potter Fire Department purchasing own trucks
- 7 Do not purchase new tanker truck for Potter Fire Department. Do not change contract.

Motion by Terry Dallmann, second by Wes Hedrich, pursuant to Section 60.10 (1)(a) of Wis. Statutes, to adopt Resolution 2011-05, a Resolution for Electors to Adopt the Town Tax Levy at Special Town Meeting of the Electors, setting the town tax levy for 2011 to be collected in 2012 at \$245,242.30; motion carried.

#### ZONING (BUILDING), CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS

The TOWN OF RANTOUL has adopted Ordinance 2011-06 – The Town of Rantoul Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map. Zoning (building) Permits and/or Condition Use Permits are required for projects over \$3,500. Application for permits may be made to the Zoning Administrator, Eugene Mertz, or to the Assistant Zoning Administrator, Mark Wunrow. Application forms and fee schedules are available on the Town website. The TOWN OF RANTOUL has also adopted the Wisconsin Uniform Dwelling Code which requires inspection of all new construction of one-and-two family dwellings and alterations over \$25,000.00 value to one-and-two family dwellings built since June 1, 1980. Building permits for construction covered by the WI UDC shall be obtained from Birschbach Inspection Services.

#### **TOWN MEETINGS**

Regular monthly Town Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at the Potter Village Hall. November through April meetings will begin at 7:00 p.m. May through October meetings will begin at 7:30 p.m. Special meetings to be held will have published notices in the Chilton Times Journal. Meeting notices and agendas will be posted at the Potter Village Hall, Gruetts, the Town Garage and Potter Post Office (when needed). Agendas and meeting change notices can also be found on the Town's website – www.townofrantoul.com.

#### DOGS

All dogs in the TOWN OF RANTOUL shall be licensed and have all required shots. Charges are \$3.00 for spayed or neutered, and \$8.00 for others. Please have your dog vaccinated before applying for a license. A late fee of \$5.00 shall be assessed to the owner of each dog 5 months of age or older, who fails to obtain a license by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Licenses are issued by the Town Treasurer, Connie Loose. Please have your proof of vaccination with you when applying for this license.

NOTE: If a person neglects to pay a dog fee on his dog, his claim for dog damages will not be paid. Fines may also be assessed.
