**ANNUAL TOWN MEETING  
APRIL 16, 2013**

Chairman Eugene Mertz called the 2013 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rantoul to order at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Six residents were in attendance, along with Board Members Eugene Mertz, David Jannette, Gregg Eickert, Mary Schwartz and Connie Loose. Chairman Mertz verified that meeting notices were published and posted.

The agenda was reviewed. Motion by Wes Hedrich, second by Dennis Hintz to accept the agenda as printed and posted with the following additions – 1. Clerk's position as part-time, 2. New tractor/mower; motion carried by voice vote. A copy follows.

The minutes from the 2012 Annual Meeting and 2012 Special Budget Meeting were next on the agenda. Motion by David Jannette, second by Gregg Eickert to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the minutes as printed in the 2012 Annual Audit Report mailed to the Town residents; motion carried by voice vote.

The 2012 Annual Financial Report was discussed. Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by Wes Hedrich to approve the 2012 Annual Financial Report; motion carried by voice vote.

David Dhein, assessor, sent in the following report:

In 2009 we had a reassessment of the Town. The assessed value for the Town went from 84.51% to 102.115% for our equalized value. This change should keep us in compliance for several years. For 2012 our equalized value is 102.49%. In 2012 there was \$3,261,700.00 added to the improvement value for the Town. This included two projects, a dairy and a shop, that were over \$2.5 million total.

Motion by David Jannette, second by Wes Hedrich to designate Collins State Bank, Calumet County Bank-Brillion and State Bank of Chilton as our public depositories; motion carried by voice vote.

Mark Wunrow gave a Road Report. The Hilbert Road project will be finished in 2013. Beckers Lake Road will be repaired. Sealcoating will be done as budget permits. Several culverts will be replaced. Irish Road by the Village of Hilbert is being studied for possible improvements to the culvert to alleviate flooding in the village.

Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by Dennis Hintz that the Board has short-term (loan to be repaid by the end of the year) borrowing power not to exceed \$50,000.00; motion carried by voice vote.

Motion by David Jannette, second by Mark Wunrow that the Board has long-term borrowing power not to exceed \$150,000.00 of new money; motion carried by voice vote.

Eugene Mertz gave a report on the Town zoning. The Plan Commission has held one public hearing on a Conditional Use Permit.

Motion by Wes Hedrich, second by Gregg Eickert to set the 2014 Annual Meeting for Tuesday, April 15, 2014, at 7:30 pm at the Potter Village Hall; motion carried by voice vote.

The appointed clerk's position was discussed. Motion by David Jannette, second by Dennis Hintz that the appointed clerk's position be a part-time position; motion carried by voice vote.

A new tractor/mower was discussed. One proposal has been obtained for \$134,000. The Town Board will continue to study this matter.

There being no other business, motion by David Jannette, second by Gregg Eickert to adjourn; motion carried by voice vote.

## November 13, 2013

The special meeting of the Electors of the Town of Rantoul was called to order by Chairman Eugene Mertz at 7:00 pm at Potter Village Hall. The purpose of this meeting was the Public Hearing and Special Town Meeting on the proposed 2014 Budget. There was one (1) town resident and the five (5) Town Board members in attendance. Discussion was held on the various budget items. Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by David Jannette to close the hearing portion of the meeting; motion carried by voice vote.

Chairman Mertz called the Special Town Meeting to order at 7:06 pm. He verified that meeting notices were posted and published. Mary Schwartz confirmed that notices were posted on October 29, 2013 and published in the Chilton Times-Journal and The Brillion News on November 7, 2013, and in the Lake-to-Lake Shopper on November 7, 2013.

Discussion was held concerning having a revaluation done in the Town. Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by David Jannette that the Board not have a revaluation done in 2014; motion carried by voice vote.

Various viewpoints were given concerning rifle hunting during deer-gun season in the Town. An article was reviewed in the Wisconsin Towns Association newsletter. No action to restrict rifle hunting was recommended.

Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by David Jannette, pursuant to Section 60.10 (1)(a) of Wis. Statutes, to adopt Resolution 2013-03, a Resolution for Electors to Adopt the Town Tax Levy at Special Town Meeting of the Electors, setting the town tax levy for 2013 to be collected in 2014 at \$255,613.11; motion carried.

### ZONING (BUILDING), CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS

The TOWN OF RANTOUL has adopted Ordinance 2011-06 – The Town of Rantoul Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map. Zoning (building) Permits and/or Condition Use Permits are required for projects over \$3,500. Application for permits may be made to the Zoning Administrator, Eugene Mertz, or to the Assistant Zoning Administrator, Mark Wunrow. Application forms and fee schedules are available on the Town website. The TOWN OF RANTOUL has also adopted the Wisconsin Uniform Dwelling Code which requires inspection of all new construction of one-and-two family dwellings and alterations over \$25,000.00 value to one-and-two family dwellings built since June 1, 1980. Building permits for construction covered by the WI UDC shall be obtained from Birschbach Inspection Services.

Licenses are issued by the Town Treasurer, Connie Loose. Please have your proof of vaccination with you when applying for this license.**

**NOTE: If a person neglects to pay a dog fee on his dog, his claim for dog damages will not be paid. Fines may also be assessed.**
