## **Town of Rantoul Mailbox Policy**


## Mailbox policy during winter maintenance:

- When a mailbox is damaged during snow removal activities, the Town Roads
  Maintenance Supervisor will repair or replace the mailbox if and only if it was actually hit by Town equipment.
- o If the snow coming off the plow or wing does the damage, there will be no repair or replacement by the Town.
- The Town Roads Supervisor that views the damaged mailbox will make the sole determination as to whether the damage was by Town of Rantoul equipment or by the snow.
- o The Town Roads Supervisor will also decide if the mailbox will be repaired or replaced.
- The Town Roads Supervisor's decision is final.
- Any replacement done by the Town Roads Supervisor will be with a standard metal mailbox. No allowance will be made for more decorative, costly mailboxes.
- No other reimbursement will be made.
- Mailboxes are permitted on public road right of ways using a standard mailbox installation, as seen below. Mailboxes not following these standards will not be eligible for replacement.

## Where to Place the Mailbox

Here are some helpful guidelines to follow when placing your mailbox:

- Position your mailbox 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry.
- Place your mailbox 6" to 8" back from the curb. If you do not have a raised curb, contact your local
- postmaster for guidance.
- Put your house or apartment number on the mailbox.
- If your mailbox is on a different street from your house or apartment, put your full street address on the box.



- Installing the Mailbox Post
- The best mailbox supports are stable but bend or fall away if a car hits them. The Federal Highway Administration recommends:
- A 4" x 4" wooden support or a 2"-diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe.
- Avoid unyielding and potentially dangerous supports, like heavy metal pipes, concrete posts, and farm equipment (e.g., milk cans filled with concrete).
- Bury your post no more than 24" deep.
