

As we turn back the clocks and our furnaces start kicking, it is a reminder to replace

the batteries in smoke detectors.

Also to improve safety, the Phelps Woman's Club has purchased smoke and carbon monoxide detectors which are now available to anyone who needs one. The Phelps Fire Department is happy to arrange to install them. If you, or a friend or family member needs one, please contact us by email at phelpsfiredepartment@gmail.com.

In regards to carbon monoxide detectors, a little known fact is that carbon monox-

ide detectors EXPIRE. Some information from one of the manufacturers of these quick beep every 30 seconds and the red end of its 7 to 10 year life. Replacing the batteries will not stop the chirp if the unit is at the end of its useful life and it will not detect the presence of carbon monoxide." CO detectors expire in 7 to 10 years! They have a manufacture date on the back of the unit. If your CO detector is beeping, check the manufacture date and if it is over 7 years old it should be replaced. Although we will be happy to come out and check your CO levels if you suspect an unsafe condition, it would be wise to check the unit first. Wishing all a safe heating season and reminder that we are here if you need us.
