New Community Center Proposal

Phelps is exploring the possibility of a new town hall and community center to be located on the present Wavering Park site. For over 20 years Phelps has been accruing funds and considering a new expanded community center. In February 2021, a committee was formed to investigate Town needs and tour other community centers in Vilas and Oneida counties. After compiling a list of needs, a top-

notch design firm was recruited to draw up concept sketches and a floor plan. Meetings were held with representatives from the Town Board, Town Offices, Library, Chamber of Commerce, Woman's Club, Lions Club and the Museum. The new community center design will include more office space, a large gathering hall for events, a larger room for Town meetings with multi-media capability, the

Chamber, the Library, and serve as a hub for future activities. A first design review was held in February and all functions provided their feedback. An information session will be held on *Tuesday*, *July* 12th at 6pm in the Wavering Park Pavilion. We encourage everyone to attend to learn more and offer feedback. If this project were to move forward, broad taxpayer support and a fund-raising campaign would be required.

Town Crew Updates

2021 was a busy year for several road repairs. We re-constructed 4.4 miles of Kentuck Lake Road and another 1/2 mile for reconstruction of Charlie's and Hazen Lane. We replaced several culverts, added gravel and graded over 50 miles of

gravel roads. Did you know we have over 102 miles of roads to maintain in Phelps! We also added a new dump truck, patrol truck and we replaced our aged backhoe. We hope to reconstruct Grosser lane this year and we applied for grant assistance.

Rick Brown is The Phelps Town Constable. He serves any writ, process order, or notice to any Phelps citizen not abiding by the town ordinances. These notices are presented to him by the Town Board and the Constable then serves the notice to the person in question.

Phelps residents can also contact the Constable at 715-617-0196 when there is a domesticated animal found on private property. The Constable will attempt to catch the pet and contact the owner. If an owner is not located, lost pets are taken to the Vilas County Humane Society.

What has the Phelps Park Commission been up to?

The Phelps Park Commission has been busy lately! In Lakefront Pines Park, boulders were added and nine flower boxes installed which are maintained by the Phelps Woman's Club. Additionally parking signage was installed and signage added at the entrance to the Conover-Phelps Bike Trail. The bandshell stage was wired and painted and the town brand *Phelps on the Lake* was affixed. And additional pier sections were added to the lakefront dock!



In other updates, Phase 1 of 2 of the Military Creek Trailhead has been completed. This includes a roughed-in parking area, entrance road, on/off loading ramps and fenced enclosures around test well caps. 80% of the trailhead costs were covered by a DNR grant! And at the Kentuck Lake boat landing, a vault toilet was installed which was also funded by a DNR grant. Finally, a new Bob Cat Tool Cat was purchased to replace the previous 10-year old Tool Cat.

In the upcoming quarter, the Park Commission plans to obtain estimates for more projects including adding additional outlets to the bandshell stage and installing perimeter wiring around the fest

grounds, for topsoil and sodding the fest grounds, for installing parking stops along the lakefront parking area, graveling around the base of the restroom slope to address drainage problems, graveling the parking area across from the Post Office, for replacing fencing around the west ball field, and for completion of Phase 2 of the Military Creek Trailhead (additional fencing, vault toilet, kiosk and some

asphalting). Additionally, a chain gate will be installed in the southeast corner of the fest grounds and a dozen picnic tables will be constructed for Lakefront Pines Park. A new overhead garage door will be installed in the storage building in Wavering Park. Two additional dock sections will be purchased for the Kentuck Lake boat landing dock using DNR grant funds. Long-range plans will be discussed to address erosion control issues along a section of park shoreline, develop a maintenance plan for structures in Wavering Park and plans to remodel the Phelps Shooting Range in several years.

As you can see, we are trying to make Lakefront Pines Park a destination location for Phelps. But, it will take us a number of years to accomplish the sod installation, addressing the drainage issue and providing maintenance-free picnic tables for the public.
