Phelps Emergency Services News

There are great things happening in Phelps emergency services! Our big news is we have 6 (yes SIX!) new members finishing their training to become EMTs (Emergency Medical Technicians). After months of grueling meetings and hands on training consisting of 4 evening hours twice a week. What a huge commitment in service to our town. These additional members will better ensure a quick and efficient response with our ambulance when you dial 911 for medical assist. So proud of all of them. We also have 2 new firefighter members.

And speaking of proud, I as the Phelps Fire Chief, and you as citizens, can be proud of several of our emergency responders that were given a special award of recognition by the town board for extraordinary service saving a life in an ice rescue in March. Members receiving this special recognition were Andy Regenfuss, Rob Andersen III, Jeremy Ryan, Sean Murphy and Damian Seals. Other emergency services members were also recognized for their help in the rescue including our emergency medical team that all contributed to a successful outcome.



We have been working all winter on a complete rebuild of our what we call our "brush truck". Now complete, and in service. It is primarily a smaller version of a fire truck well suited to wild land fires as it is a nimble truck with pumping and suction water transfer capabilities. It is well suited to any of the smaller fire incidents as it is quick with a hose reel rather than a large compliment of heavy hose. Big trucks for big stuff and this unit for smaller incidents. As we were determining how to



set it up, we opted for a high capacity suction ability pump to be able to transfer water from the many streams and lakes into tanker trucks when hydrant water is not feasible as a water source. We have had several trainings with this new unit and are very pleased with results. We can move 3000 gallons of water from a lake into a tanker truck in 7 minutes 11 seconds! 417 gallons a minute! For perspective, your kitchen faucet flows about

3 gallons a minute.

We applied for and received a partial grant for the pump for



the new truck from the DNR, and ALL the rest of the project was paid for with fundraising and donations and NO property tax dollars. This truck will also be used for pulling the off road rescue unit and the other ongoing project, the open water rescue boat which is nearing completion. More to follow on that project in the next newsletter.

A huge THANK YOU to the community for their support as we promise ours in service.



Town Website - www.townofphelps.com Visit the Town website to find various forms and applications, answers to common questions, a calendar of events, meeting agendas and minutes, town contacts, news, notices, and much more. While there scroll down on the homepage for the option to Subscribe to Receive Town Updates. Updates can be received by text message or email.

Permits - All Building Permits are applied for through the Vilas County Zoning Department. Mitch Buhler is the Deputy Zoning Administrator for the Town of Phelps. Mitch can be

reached at 715-479-3734, or apply online at vilascountywi.gov. The only permits issued by A website for all things relating to Wisconsin the Town of Phelps are Driveway Permits for Elections. Here you can register to vote, up-Town roads only.

Property Tax Bills – If your mailing address has recently changed, be sure to contact Vilas County to update it by November 15, 2024. This will ensure timely delivery of your tax bill. Visit vilascountywi.gov to update.

Lottery Credit – If you have made Phelps your primary residence within the last couple of years, check your tax bill to make sure you are receiving the lottery credit! Information and answers to commonly asked questions can be found here: www.revenue.wi.gov/ Pages/Form/lottery-home.aspx

MyVote WI – www.myvote.wi.gov date your name and address, request an absentee ballot, find out when elections are scheduled and what's on the ballot, view election results, and more.
