Town of Phelps Board to Host Golden Shovel Groundbreaking Ceremony for new DPW Building

Phelps, Wisconsin, August 11, 2025 - The Town of Phelps Board invites community members, press partners and business leaders throughout the community to join them as they celebrate a major milestone in the planned expansion of community services for the Town of Phelps. The ceremony will take place on Friday, August 15th at 9 a.m. at 2064 Strong Road, Phelps, WI and will include commentary from community leaders and project partners in the project's success.

The project includes a brand-new, ground-up 16,000 square foot Department of Public Works facility which will offer the community upgraded DPW maintenance services and a central coordination location for increased efficiency and service delivery.

Town of Phelps Board President, Steve Doyen, said, "This is the first step in an exciting and bright future for everyone throughout the Phelps community. We are pleased deliver our neighbors the highest level of service and to support our public works team with the resources and environment they need to be successful, as we grow."

Both the architecture and the construction management services will be led by Wisconsin-based J.H. Hassinger Inc., a full-service design build, general contracting and self-performance construction firm. Additionally, Reyn Engineering will support the structural engineering, and Mach IV will focus on the civil engineering support.

The groundbreaking event marks an exciting continuation of development momentum throughout the Phelps community.
