The Library, the Eclipse, and You!

Monday, April 8, Middletown Springs will **experience 98.86% of** a total eclipse of the sun. The library is open that afternoon (as usual) and welcomes the community to gather in the backyard to view the eclipse from there. They will be handing out solar eclipse safety glasses, sunshine punch and cookies, and a solar-inspired craft. The library has some outdoor furniture or bring your own. If the weather is rotten, there will still be fabulous refreshments and a live-stream of NASA's broadcast of the eclipse. The partial eclipse begins at 2:14pm as the moon starts to move in front of the sun. It will peak at 3:27pm when the total eclipse will darken Vermont's daytime sky, lasting about 3 minutes. The phenomenon will continue as a partial eclipse until 4:37 p.m. So, avoid the predicted crowds and traffic up north, and join your neighbors to witness this stellar solar event from the library lawn!

Vegetables are a must on a diet. I suggest carrot cake, zucchini bread, and pumpkin pie.



Strawberry Jam 5k


