

State Primary Election Basics from the Town Clerk's office

Here's what you need to know about the upcoming primary election.

- Election Day Tuesday, August 13, 2024
- Polls Open 7am to 7pm at the Town Office
- Sample ballots and official warning are available on the town's website https://middletownsprings.vt.gov/town-government/town-meeting-elections/ (fyi webpage links do not work correctly on mobile phones.)
- Absentee Ballots MUST be requested for this election!
- Ballot requests can be made up until Monday, August 12 at 4pm.
- Requests can be completed:
 - By mail using an absentee ballot request form

You can register to vote up to and including election day.

How to register to vote

- At the town office anytime including election day.
- Online using https://olvr.vermont.gov

Other things to remember for the primary election -

- If you requested absentee ballots before town meeting for all elections in 2024, and you haven't received it, Please reach out to the Town Clerk ASAP. Absentee ballots were mailed the first week of July.
- If you are returning a ballot from an out of state location, please be sure to allow enough time for us to receive your ballot by mail.
- Please read and follow the absentee ballot instructions on each envelope you receive in your absentee packet.
- Absentee ballots can be mailed or dropped off in the drop box outside the town office anytime up until 7pm on election day.
- Primary election day is Tuesday, August 13, 2024
- You can check the status of your ballot request, or your ballot return anytime via https://mvp.vermont.gov.

Note from the Town Treasurer

New Property Tax Bills for fiscal year 24/25 will be mailed to you by mid-August.

Your first payment will be due on or before Monday, September 16, 2024.

Please save your bill for future reference. You will need this document to: give to your mortgage company, file your Vermont income taxes in April, refinance, or sell your property, and remind yourself how much you owe quarterly.

Included on your tax bill will be a homestead rebate if you applied and qualified for it. The State of Vermont determines if you are eligible for a rebate.

If you have any questions regarding the status of your homestead rebate, contact the Vermont Department of Taxes directly at: https://tax.vermont.gov or (802) 828-2865.

IMPORTANT: If your mailing address has changed, please advise.

Also, if you have not received your new bill by mid-August, please email mtstreasurer@vermontel.net (or call 802-235-3256) and confirm your name, parcel address and mailing address.

When east meets west, meets north, meets south, what do you get? Middletown! Add healing waters and, of course, you get Middletown Springs.



- Vermont Historic Sites Pass: Free admission.

Overdue Notices

In order for the library to be as useful as possible to the community, we would like to remind everyone of our lending procedures. As well as give an update on our policy regarding overdue items.

Most library materials circulate for a two-week lending period. They are often able to be renewed for another two weeks. We do not charge fines for overdue items, and are always understanding when patrons return late books. This said, we have a number of books from our collection that are long overdue.

To help keep track of our circulating materials and to prompt patrons to renew or return items they have checked out, we have instituted some new procedures. At the beginning of the week, we will send an automated email to patrons with a list of items they have checked out from the library. It will include all items that are out and note when they are due.

Once a month we will send letters to patrons who have items that are more than 4 weeks overdue. And later in the month we will send bills requesting compensating donations for any items that have still not been returned or renewed.

To renew items, simple email, call, or stop in the library. Most items can be renewed unless someone else has requested them.

We appreciate your help in getting these items back into circulation so that other community members can enjoy them.

When returning items to the library, please stop by during open hours OR use the drop box next to the door. If you are unable to find the items checked out to you, please let us know.
