What is *Free Indeed*? Is it a party? Well, sort of—you walk into the warmth of Christmas music and decorations.


Is it a store? Well, sort of—you walk through rooms filled with displays of decorations, gifts, toys, games, clothing for all ages, collectibles, household items and much more.

### **Property Tax Payment Reminder**

The second installment for 24/25 property taxes is due on or before Monday, December 16.

Payments can be made as follows:

- 1. Mail to PO Box 1022, Middletown Springs, VT 05757 (with a 12/16/24 or earlier postmark.)
- 2. Deposit in the black mail slot on the outside wall of the town office (to the left of the South Street entrance door) by the end of the day of 12/16/24.

Please do not remit tax payments to the Town Clerk, as she is not authorized to accept them.

Tax payments received or postmarked after December 16, 2024 will incur a late fee of 1% for 3 months and 1.5% thereafter until paid.



Mark your calendars for Sunday December 8 at the Middletown Springs Elementary School, from 10am-3pm.


### **Pleasant View Cemetery Gate Closed**

The entrance gate to the Pleasant View Cemetery is now closed for the winter season, effective December 1, 2024. We try and leave the gate open as long as reasonably possible in order to allow for the placement of Christmas wreaths and remembrances on loved ones memorials around the Thanksgiving holiday. With the onset of the winter season and the increasing likelihood of snow and ice, visitor access to the site must be limited to foot traffic due to public safety concerns.

We encourage patrons to remove old and faded decorations, artificial flowers (which are not allowed), and dead or dying plants around their loved ones grave sites.

It is a big task to keep the grounds mowed and manicured in a presentable manner during the summer months, and we are grateful for the fine job that Green Mountain Boys Landscaping from Wells, VT, has done for us in managing this property.

We expect to work with the 6th grade class from Middletown Springs Elementary School again next April for assistance with the spring cleanup effort. Until then, enjoy a safe and healthy winter season, and the entrance gate will be open again on or around the first of May 2025, weather permitting.

# Prepare for Town Meeting 2025

Do you want to request an Absentee Ballot? You need a new request for the new calendar year. There are a few ways to make your request:

- Log into your My Voter Page, <a href="https://mvp.vermont.gov">https://mvp.vermont.gov</a> and request your ballots online.
- <u>Download an Absentee Ballot Request</u> from the town's website.
- Call (802) 235-2220 or stop by the clerk's office to request that ballots be mailed to you.

#### Do you want to register to vote?

- To register online, go to <a href="https://olvr.vermont.gov">https://olvr.vermont.gov</a> to register to vote.
- <u>Download a Voter Registration</u> form from the town's website. Return the completed form to the clerk's office.
- Stop by the clerk's office to complete the registration in person.

## New Fees for Dog Licenses in 2025!

Dog Registration for 2025 opens on January 2, 2025. FEES have increased by \$2 across the board. Additional fees all go to the State of Vermont for animal welfare programs.

Licensure requires that all dogs or wolf-hybrids over the age of 3 months have a current rabies vaccination. Certification of Vaccination must be on file with or presented to the town clerk at the time of registration.

For animals registered on or before April 1, 2025

Neutered or Spayed - \$11.00 Not Neutered or Spayed - \$15.00

If registered after April 1, 2025, late fees apply

Neutered or Spayed - \$13.00 Not Neutered or Spayed - \$19.00
