



- Call (802) 235-2220 or stop by the clerk's office to request that ballots be mailed to you.

- Complete this form and return it to the clerk's office.

# Middletown Springs Historical Society Announces Maple Raffle

With 35 items, each valued at \$100 or more, the Middletown Springs Historical Society (MSHS) kicks off its annual Maple Festival Raffle. The Grand Prize item is the winner's choice of a gift certificate for 100 gallons of heating oil from Johnson Energy or the cash equivalent, around \$400.

Other raffle items include gift cards from local and regional stores and restaurants, home and garden décor, specialty services, and even a unique barn venue for your family or group event. In addition, Middletown Springs residents offer their expertise in massage, natural history, computer consulting, and connecting with horses. Participants can target their tickets for individual item raffles, increasing their chances of winning what they want.



Raffle drawings for each of the items will be held during the 2025 Maple Festival on Sunday, March 16, at the Historical Society where you can view all of the items. Winners do not have to be present and will be notified to arrange for pickup or shipping. Winners will be responsible for shipping costs.

"We are sincerely heartened by the generous raffle donations we have received from MSHS members and friends, local businesses and regional stores," says Maple Festival Chair Pat Hemenway.

All proceeds from the raffle support MSHS educational and historic preservation projects including the Mineral Springs Park, the MSHS Museum, and the historic Adams House.

#### **CEDRR Ballot Item**

The Chamber & Economic Development of the Rutland Region (CEDRR) has submitted a ballot item for Town Meeting in support of the County's Regional Marketing Initiative. CEDRR is respectfully requesting a FY2026 appropriation in the amount of \$745. The Regional Marketing Initiative continues to be a Rutland County-wide collaboration between municipalities, the region's business community, and our organization. The businesses in our region are essential to supporting our way of life. Our goal is to increase the County's population, growing our skilled workforce, in support of economic and community growth.

Since 2021, we have assisted 234 people in becoming our newest neighbors within Rutland County. Already, 11 people are planning to relocate here in 2025. We expect this number to increase as it typically does throughout the year.

The Regional Marketing Initiative is entering year-nine and has an anticipated budget for 2025 of \$140,000. The Town of Middletown Springs' previous and future participation has been and will be essential to the success of the program.



#### Plan ahead for April 2025 Income Tax filing!

You will be required to file your annual Vermont Homestead Declaration and your Property Tax Assistance request. For this filing, you will need the copy of your property tax bill that was mailed to you in August 2024. Please take the time to locate your copy now.

You will need to provide this tax bill copy yourself to your accountant or tax service.

It is not the responsibility of the Town Treasurer (or even the Town Clerk) to submit this document to your accountant/tax service; we do not have the resources to again remit your bills.

## Dog Licenses Available Now!

Dog Registration for 2025 opens on January 2, 2025. Fees have increased by \$2 across the board. Additional fees all go to the State of Vermont for animal welfare programs.

Vermont state law requires all dogs or wolf-hybrids 6 months or older be licensed with the Town Clerk on or before April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquisition. All license fees include funds required to be sent to the state rabies and spay and neuter programs.

Licensure requires that all dogs or wolf-hybrids over the age of 3 months have a current rabies vaccination. Certification of Vaccination must be on file with or presented to the town clerk at the time of registration.

Registration Fees January 1, 2024 thru April 1, 2024 Neutered or Spayed - \$11.00 Not Neutered or Spayed - \$15.00

Why should I register my dog? Beyond the state law, when someone finds a loose or injured dog, the first place they call is the Town Office. If the town clerk has your information, she can help to reunite you. Please help her, help you by making time to get your dog registered.

Note: If your schedule just doesn't fit the clerk's office hours, you can still get your pet registered. You can mail your payment, rabies certificate, and other pertinent information to PO Box 1232, Middletown Springs 05757 or drop your information into the "Clerk's Dropbox" outside the South Street entrance of the town office. The Town Clerk will process and mail you the license(s) and tag(s).
