There will be a community forum where the following will be discussed:

Budget Recommendations

Inviting taxpayers of the Middletown Springs and Wells community to an open forum to ask questions and express preferences on the upcoming school budget. There is projected budget increase due to rising costs in salaries, increased secondary enrollment, health insurance, supply costs, and maintenance.

Budget is projected (not finalized) to N increase of 6.45%. Based on state estimates and information we have today. This would translate to no increases in taxes. *

The board is looking at potentially changing the following programs:

- Food Services: Changing from in-house food preparation to a federally licensed vendor. Going to bid with other GRSCU schools with a food vendor is estimated to save \$70,000 per year, which would amount to a 1.3% drop or approx. \$20 in taxes per \$100.000 in assessed value. *
- Transportation: Eliminating bus service at Wells or going down to one bus could result in a savings of \$45,000-\$90,000, which would amount to a 0.8% 1.6% drop or approx. \$12 \$24 in taxes per \$100.000 in assessed value. *
- After-School and Summer Programming: Asking parents to cover the full cost or a high percentage of cost (90%) of after school and summer programming is projected to save \$45,000, which would amount to

a 0.8% drop or approx. \$12 in taxes per \$100,000 in assessed value. *

Please join us and help guide the board to a decision.

* Amounts presented do not include credits received in homestead declaration and property tax credit claim.

2023 Absentee Ballot Requests

Now is the time to request an absentee ballot for 2023 elections. If you'd like to add your name to the list of people who will receive an absentee ballot by mail in 2023, you will need to complete an absentee ballot request form. State law allows for voters to request absentee ballots for a single election or for a full calendar year. Here's where you can obtain a request form.

2023 Town Meeting Calendar

Thursday, January 19 – Last day to file a petition to place an item on the town meeting ballot.

Petition needs signatures of 5% of registered voters (currently = 35).

Monday, January 30 – Last day to file a Candidate Petition & Consent of Candidate form to run for local office. Need signatures of 1% of registered voters (currently = 7).

Wednesday, February 1 – Last day to withdraw Candidate Petition.

Wednesday, February 15 – Ballots must be available for early voting.

Wednesday, March 1 – Wells Springs School District Informational Meeting at Wells Village School & virtually, at 7pm.

Monday, March 6 – Last day for absentee ballot requests – close of business (4pm).

Dog Registrations are now OPEN

Please register your dogs!

Vermont state law requires all dogs or wolf-hybrids 6 months or older be licensed with the town clerk **on or before April 1** of each year or within 30 days of acquisition. The fees include funds required to be sent to the state for its rabies and spay and neuter programs.

Licensure requires that all dogs or wolf-hybrids over the age of 3 months have a current rabies vaccination. Certification of vaccination must be on file with or be presented to the town clerk at the time of registration.

Registration Fees

Neutered or Spayed - \$9 Not Neutered or Spayed - \$13

WHY SHOULD I REGISTER MY DOG?

1) helps identify your dog if lost, 2) provides proof your dog is protected from rabies in the event your dog is bitten by a rabid animal, but would still need immediate medical attention, 3) if your dog bites an animal or person – which could result in quarantine or possible euthanasia to test for infection, and 4) helps pay for VSNIP, which addresses the animal population situation in Vermont.

Most importantly, when someone finds a loose or injured dog, the first place they call is the town office. If I have your information, I can help to reunite you. I get countless calls where I have no good information to help get a pet back home quickly. Please help me to help you and make the time to get your dog registered.

NOTE: If your schedule just doesn't fit the clerk's office hours, you can still get your pet registered. You can mail your payment, rabies certificate, and other pertinent information to the town clerk at PO Box 1232, Middletown Springs 05757 and I will complete the registration and mail you back the license(s) and tag(s).
