Middletown Springs Historical Society Announces Maple Raffle

One of the items in the Middletown Springs Historical Society's Maple Raffle is a 5-hour rental for up to 30 people at the 1780's Reuben Wait Barn at Green Mountain Timber Frames in Middletown Springs.

With 37 items, each valued at \$100 or more, the Middletown Springs Historical Society (MSHS) kicks off its annual Maple Festival Raffle. The Grand Prize item is the winner's choice of a gift certificate for 100 gallons of heating oil from Johnson Energy or the cash equivalent, around \$400.

Other raffle items include gift cards from local and regional stores and restaurants, home and garden décor, specialty services, and even a unique historic barn venue for your group event. In addition, Middletown Springs residents offer their expertise in massage, natural history consulting, computer consulting, and connecting with horses. Participants can target their tickets for individual item raffles, increasing their chances of getting what they want.

Raffle tickets are \$25 each or five tickets for \$100. Tickets and payments must be returned by mail, postmarked by March 13. For a list of raffle items, downloadable tickets, and instructions, visit the historical society's website at www.mshsvt.org.

Separate raffle drawings for each of the 37 items will be held during the 2024 Maple Festival on Sunday, March 17, at the historical society building. Winners do not have to be present and will be notified to arrange for pickup or shipping. Winners will be responsible for shipping costs.

"We are sincerely heartened by the generous raffle donations we have received from MSHS members and friends, local businesses and regional stores," says Maple Festival Chair Pat Hemenway. Highway Foreman Apprentice

The Town of Middletown Springs is seeking an individual to serve as the highway foreman's apprentice, during the final year of our current foreman's excellent service before his retirement. If the apprenticeship period is successful, our hope is that this person be prepared to take on the role of highway foreman in October 2024.

This is a supervisory position, reporting to the foreman but overseeing the work of other highway crewmembers. It also entails collaboration with other regional, state, and federal agencies; negotiating and contracting with vendors; writing funding proposals for grants; careful recordkeeping; and excellent communication with the public and with the selectboard. A valid Vermont-issued CDL Class B license or above is required. Required skills include proficient operation and maintenance of a road grader, excavator, front-end loader. backhoe, and tandem plow truck.

The pay is competitive and dependent on qualifications.

Benefits include: health insurance; paid time off; pension plan; and 12 paid holidays.

Solar Eclipse Party @ the Library Monday, April 8

Join us in the library's backyard for our Near-Total Eclipse Party!

We will have solar eclipse safety glasses, sunshine punch and cookies, and some solar-inspired crafts. We have some lawn chairs but you are encouraged to bring your own.

Being so close to the path of totality, we will see the moon will cover 98.86% of the sun! Unless of course it is cloudy then we will still have fabulous refreshments and stream NASA's broadcast of the eclipse.

A partial eclipse begins at 2:14pm as the moon starts to move in front of the sun. It will hit peak at 3:27pm when the total eclipse will darken Vermont's daytime sky, lasting about 3 minutes. The phenomenon will continue as a partial eclipse until 4:37 p.m.

So, avoid the crowds and join your neighbors to witness this stellar solar event! Vermont officials are now expecting up to 200,000 visitors to descend on Vermont seeking a good view of this extraordinary phenomenon.

Transfer Station Attendant

The Town of Middletown Springs is currently accepting applications for the position of part-time transfer station attendant. Duties and responsibilities include the ability to handle a variety of tasks, including operating the solid waste compactor and the zero-sort recycling compactor, as well as constantly monitoring the status of these systems. The Attendant must also learn the acceptable types of materials that may be disposed of at the transfer station, including the proper electronics procedures, battery storage and shipping protocols, and related activities.

The attendant will handle cash transactions and maintain appropriate financial records in addition to assisting patrons at the transfer facility. Basic mechanical skills and equipment maintenance are required, along with a positive public service attitude and the ability to maintain a neat and organized work environment.

Warnings for all three elections (Town Meeting, School District Meeting, Presidential Primary) and other pertinent election information including voter registration and absentee ballot request forms are also on the Town Meeting & Elections page.

Town Meeting is Tuesday, March 5, 2024, with the Town Informational Meeting to be held on Monday, March 4, starting at 6:30pm at the Middletown Springs Elementary School. Remote attendance will also be available.

Polls will be open on Tuesday, March 5 from 7am to 7pm in the new Middletown Springs Town Office – 5 South Street.

Absentee ballots can be requested now through Monday, March 4 at 4pm (close of business). To receive an absentee ballot, you must complete an absentee ballot request form. State law allows for voters to request absentee ballots for a single election or for a full calendar year. This year we are also holding the Presidential Primary on March 5, you must choose a party to receive that early ballot.

Middletown Springs Maple Festival Offers Sweet Fun

Maple lore and demonstrations, hearty lunch items, sugar-on-snow, maple "spun gold", sweet treats from local kitchens, and a Maple Raffle featuring 37 items each valued at \$100 or more are the highlights of the 2024 Annual Maple Festival of the Middletown Springs Historical Society on Sunday, March 17 from 1-4 pm.

The event will feature an outdoor demonstration of early maple sugarmaking in a cast iron kettle over an open fire. Indoors, local sugarmaker Ryan Mahar and historians David Wright and Jon Mathewson will give a presentation at 2pm on maple sugaring history and current practice illustrated by artifacts from the historical society collection.

In the dining room, homemade soup, chili, mac'n'cheese and delicious maple desserts created by historical society cooks, as well as Vermont maple products and new 2024 syrup will be available for sale. Old-fashioned sugar-on-snow, blueberry pancakes with maple syrup, and maple "spun gold" cotton candy are always favorites. Acoustic music enlivens the free afternoon event. Videos about Vermont maple sugaring will be shown continuously.

The grand prize item in the Maple Raffle is the winner's choice of a gift certificate for 100 gallons of heating oil from Johnson Energy or the cash equivalent, around \$400. Other raffle items include gift cards from local and regional stores and restaurants, artwork and collectibles, and even a rental of the historic Reuben Waite Barn at Green Mountain Timber Frame in Middletown Springs for you family or business celebration. Additionally this year, Middletown Springs residents offer their expertise in holistic arts, natural history, computer consulting, and connecting with horses.

Note From the Treasurer

1. Third Quarter Property Tax payments for 23/24 are due on or before Friday, March 15.

Payments can be made as follows:

- A. MAIL to PO Box 1022, Middletown Springs, VT 05757 (with a 3/15/24 or earlier postmark.)
- B. Deposit in the NEW black mail slot on the OUTSIDE wall of the town office (to the left of the South Street entrance door) by 7pm on 3/15/24.

Please do not remit tax payments to the town clerk, as she is not authorized to accept them.

Include a self-addressed stamped envelope if you would like a receipt.

Tax payments received or postmarked after March 15, 2024 will incur a late fee of 1% for 3 months and 1.5% thereafter until paid.

2. When you file your INCOME taxes in April, you will also be required to file your annual Vermont Homestead Declaration and your Property Tax Assistance request.

For this filing, you will need the copy of your property tax bill that was mailed to you in August 2023. Please take the time to locate your copy.

You will need to provide this tax bill copy yourself to your accountant or tax service.

It is not the responsibility of the town treasurer (or even the town clerk) to submit this document to your accountant/tax service; we do not have the resources to again remit tax bills to you. Dog Registrations are Now OPEN - Please Register Your Dogs!

Vermont state law requires all dogs or wolf-hybrids 6 months or older be licensed with the town clerk on or before April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquisition. All license fees include funds required to be sent to the state rabies and spay and neuter programs. Licensure requires that all dogs or wolf-hybrids over the age of 3 months have a current rabies vaccination.

Certification of vaccination must be on file with or presented to the town clerk at the time of registration.

Registration Fees January 1, 2024 thru April 1, 2024 Neutered or Spayed - \$9.00

Not Neutered or Spayed - \$13.00

WHY SHOULD I REGISTER MY DOG? Beyond the state law, when someone finds a loose or injured dog, the first place they call is the town office. If I have your information, I can help to reunite you. Please help me, help you by making time to get your dog registered.

NOTE: If your schedule just doesn't fit the clerk's office hours, you can still get your pet registered. You can mail your payment, rabies certificate, and other pertinent information to the town clerk at PO Box 1232, Middletown Springs 05757 or drop your information into the "Clerk's Dropbox" outside the South Street entrance of the new town office and I will complete the registration and mail you back the license(s) and tag(s).

The town clerk's office is open on Monday & Tuesday 9am - 4pm and Thursday & Friday 1pm - 4pm.
