

A Note from the Town Treasurer

Property Tax payments for the 4th and FINAL Quarter of Fiscal Year 23/24 are due on or before Monday, June 17, 2024.

Payments can be made as follows:

- A. MAIL to PO Box 1022, Middletown Springs, VT 05757 (with a 6/17/24 or earlier postmark.)
- **B.** Deposit in the black mail slot on the OUTSIDE wall of the Town Office (to the left of the South Street entrance door) by 7pm on 6/17/24.

Tax payments postmarked after 6/17/24 or received in the Town Office Mail slot after 6/17/24 are considered LATE and DELINQUENT – **NO EXCEPTIONS**. A penalty AND a late fee will be assessed as follows:

Penalty: 8 % on all FY23/24 outstanding amounts, and **Late fee**: 1% interest for the 1st 3 months of delinquency, and 1.5% interest per month thereafter on 4th quarter amount due.

If you require a receipt, please include a self addressed, stamped envelope with your remittance.

PLEASE, do not remit taxes to the Town Clerk, as she is not authorized to accept them.

LOOKING AHEAD – new tax bills will be mailed directly to all property owners in mid-August for the new Fiscal Year 24/25. Please SAVE them as you will need them for tax payment, mortgage escrow, refinance, and annual homestead declaration. It's the only copy you will receive.

Open Position: Transfer Station Attendant

The Town of Middletown Springs is currently accepting applications for the position of part-time Transfer Station Attendant. Duties and responsibilities include the ability to handle a variety of tasks, including operating the solid waste compactor and the zero-sort recycling compactor, as well as constantly monitoring the status of these systems. The attendant must also learn the acceptable types of materials that may be disposed of at the transfer station, including the proper electronics procedures, battery storage and shipping protocols, and related activities.

The attendant will handle cash transactions and maintain appropriate financial records in addition to assisting patrons at the transfer facility. Basic mechanical skills and equipment maintenance are required, along with a positive public service attitude and the ability to maintain a neat and organized work environment. Strawberry Jam 5k



Tinmouth Plant Sale

It's spring and warmer weather is coming. And, so is the Tinmouth Plant Sale! This non-profit sale benefits the community.

Volunteers are needed to help dig, pot, move plants and set up. If you have plants to donate, please let us know what they are. Knowing the color and variety is important; people won't buy a daylily that they think might be the common roadside orange, for example. If you don't know the name of the variety, a description is good; a photograph is superb.

This is a wonderful way to divide your plants to keep them looking their best and help fund the Tinmouth Continuing Education Scholarship Fund. You can drop plants after April 12 at 148 Channel Road, Tinmouth.

We can always use flowerpots that are 6" or larger, clay or plastic. No small ones, please; the plants we sell are too robust to fit into those.

Volunteering is a great chance to "blossom blab" with fellow gardeners, and maybe learn a few things about different perennials. There are always some orphan plants looking for good homes, too.

We dig and pot up plants from mid-April to early May with the sale beginning this year May 11 and running through May 19. Please note that due to late snow and much rain the sale dates have changed. Plants will be 50% off on the last day of the sale, now May 19. The Squier Family Farm at 12 McNamara Road will be hosting the event again.


What books do you want to read that you wish the library had?
