

### **Large Dumpster Day**

The Spring version of Large Dumpster Day is rapidly approaching, and we look forward to seeing many townsfolk on Saturday, May 10, 2025. The event will be held from 6:00am until 12pm at 577 West Street, opposite Parker Water Wells.

Middletown Springs residents may discard large unused or unwanted items such as furniture, mattresses, children's toys, and small amounts of construction/demolition debris that do not qualify as normal household trash (no contractors please). The charge per vehicle OR trailer load is \$10.00; truck and trailer loads are \$10.00 each (or \$20.00). Metal-only loads may be disposed of for free.

Please note that in the interest of staff safety and efficiency, all small items must be in contractor bags or some form of disposable container. This will aid staff in the unloading process and create a safer work environment. Non-conforming loads may be turned away at the staff's discretion.

Regular household trash and recyclable items, including electronics, must be taken to the Fort Dumpster facility. Items containing refrigerant (freezers, refrigerators, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and the like) are subject to a \$25.00 fee per item and will be accepted at either the West Street location or the Fort Dumpster site during this event only.

Please note that hazardous materials such as paints, oils, propane tanks, other solvents and the like are not accepted. Tires are not accepted at this event.

Metal items may be disposed of at no charge. The work crew would greatly appreciate mixed loads that are separated as much as possible in order to simplify the unloading process.

Please bring exact change or a personal check in the correct amount (payable to the Town of Middletown Springs) and remain in your vehicle unless instructed otherwise. The Town of Middletown Springs shall **not** be responsible for any damages that may occur during the loading or unloading process.

### Note from the Town Treasurer

Property Tax payments for the 4th and **final** quarter of tax year 24/25 are due on or before Monday, June 16, 2025.

Post-dated checks are honored so that you don't need to wait until the last minute to make your payment.

Payments can be made as follows:

- Mail to PO Box 1022, Middletown Springs, VT 05757 (with a 6/16/25 or earlier postmark.)
- Deposit in the black mail slot on the **outside** wall of the Town Office (to the left of the South Street entrance door) by 7pm on 6/16/25.

If you require a receipt, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your remittance.

Tax payments postmarked after 6/16/25 or received in the Town Office Mail slot after 6/16/25 are considered **late** and **delinquent - no exceptions**. A penalty **and** a late fee **will** be assessed as follows:

- Penalty: 8 % on ALL FY24/25 outstanding amounts, and
- Late fee: 1% interest fee for each of the 1st 3 months of delinquency, and 1.5% interest per month thereafter on the 6/16/25 amount.

Additionally, as of 6/30/25 any amounts still unpaid for tax year 24/25 will be forwarded to the Delinquent Tax Collector for collection.

**Please**, do not remit taxes to the Town Clerk, as she is not authorized to accept them. The Treasurer will be in the town office to accept inperson payments on 6/16/25 from approximately 11 am -3 pm.

Looking ahead – new tax bills will be mailed directly to all property owners in mid-August for the new Fiscal Year 25/26 – first payment will be due by 9/15/25. Please save your tax bill as it will be needed for tax payment, mortgage escrow, refinance, and annual homestead declaration. It's the only copy you will receive as we do not send out quarterly reminders.
