### **Town Office Update**

You have probably seen the lights on in the new Town Office on the corner. The Town Office moved over from the old digs in the Historical Society on September 29 and opened in the new space on October 3. While the new space is functional we are still waiting for final touches like the shelving system in the vault, enough chairs, and some non-wobbly tables. On Saturday November 11th, the Select Board has invited the community to an open house, to welcome residents to this wonderful new Town Office which finally meets our requirements for secure storage of records and functional dedicated spaces for the Clerk, Treasurer, and Listers and others.

This beautiful building has been a long time in the making, from multiple search committees looking for viable sites, visits to other towns, purchase and remediation of the Parker Service Station lot, design committees and design variations, several confirming town votes, voter authorization to borrow construction funds, selection of an architect, a construction management firm, sub contractors, and countless hours and generous gifts from town residents and elected officials.

The following figures are not final but will provide a close idea of the project costs.

Beginning in 2013 voters have approved putting \$50,000 a year into a reserve fund for construction of a new town office. This commitment was critical in proving town support for the project. With a final design from Geoff Metcalfe at Keefe and Wesner Architects and selection of Naylor and Breen as construction managers we were ready to go. The initial estimates for the building came in at \$973,000. On the strength of that estimate and voter approval in November 2021, the Town locked in an \$800,000 building loan from the Bank of Middlebury (at just under 3% interest!) with the balance to come from the Town Facilities Reserve Account.

Then came Covid-19 supply line breakdowns, a stunning scarcity of sub contractors, and skyrocketing material costs. The building estimate rose to \$1,543,081 with estimated additional costs of \$126,000 in architectural and engineering services, permits and fees, and costs for excavating and replacing "unsuitable soils".

## Town Office Update ... continued

Working with the architect and builders we pared down, cut costs, revised plans, beat the bushes for subcontractors, extended the timeline and reduced the building cost down to \$1,126,990.90. This cost did not include the plumbing and heating bid which was still being revised, or items outside of the construction contract like vault storage, cabinets, shelving, and furniture, computer network and security system, and later additions like a secure drop box for tax payments.

The current cost of the building itself stands at \$1,207,533, with the building and all additional costs at \$1,245,539. This is not the "final figure" as a few more small bills will trickle in but it should be pretty close. All expenses are covered by the construction loan, money from the Town Facilities account, and a portion of federal ARPA funds allocated to the Town. The annual payment on the loan is very close to the \$50,000 allocation that the voters had already approved. Starting next year that allocation will be replaced by a loan payment of a similar amount.

We will provide follow-up information when the dust settles.
