You don't need to donate to "shop". Stop by the library to peruse our selection of great cookbooks looking for new homes.


Nevermore!

So, wear your comfiest PJs, bring your favorite stuffed animal and whatever else you need to get cozy and settle in for some stories.



Have You Voted?

The General Election is Tuesday, November 5!

If you were registered to vote on 9/9/2024, you should have received an absentee ballot in the mail. At this point it's too late to mail your ballot back. Please return your ballots by using the Ballot Drop-box at the town office or walk it into the clerk's office.

Plan to vote in person? Please bring your ballot with you! If you don't want to vote the ballot mailed to you, you can turn it in for a replacement, but if you do not bring your issued ballot to the polls, you will be required to sign an Affidavit of No Ballot Cast.

Still need to register? In Vermont you can register to vote up to and including on election day.

Registrations can be completed online at https://olvr.vermont.gov/, at the town office or the library.

Please note, election day registrations can only take place at your local polling place.

Not sure if you are registered? You can check the status of your ballot or voter registration status at any time by visiting My Voter Page https://mvp.vermont.gov/. There you will also find the 2024 General Election online voter guide which includes general information as well as information specific to your ballot.

Award Winning Turnip Grown Locally



A judge at the Gilfeather Turnip Festival in Wardsboro, Vt., on Oct. 27 hoists a 33 lb. award-winning Gilfeather turnip grown by David Wright of Middletown Springs named "Gilfeather's Champ" after its resemblance to the elusive Lake Champlain Monster.

The annual festival and celebration honors farmer John Gilfeather (1865-1944) the developer of the tasty root delicacy in the 1880s. The Gilfeather turnip was declared the Vermont State Vegetable by the Legislature in 2016 after a two-year lobbying effort by Wardsboro Elementary School 5th & 6th graders.

Eight plays written by area writers - and one from Chicago - and dynamically read by our community's actors form the centerpiece of four nights of delicious food and entertainment at Stone Valley Arts in Poultney, 145 East Main Street, Friday November 8, Saturday November 9 and Friday November 15 and Saturday November 16.

The included dinner is served from 5:30-6:45; plays begin at 7:00 pm.

Four plays geared toward adults are presented each night after a delectable harvest dinner — one set of four November 8-9, with the other set November 15-16. The plays are skillfully directed by Meg Bouchard, one by Melissa Chesnut-Tangerman. If you want to see all eight over the two weekends, a discount is offered for two night's tickets.

"This event is committed to supporting the writers' work," says director Meg Bouchard. "They witness what happens with their words in the directorial process as the actors find the truth, the humor, the pathos and the humanity of their characters. It's truly a community experience — audiences love being part of the process as well, in the opportunity to give feedback after the readings."

For a \$25 ticket enjoy a scrumptious fall dinner of soups, salads and sides served from 5:30-6:45, and an evening of four plays presented in workshop; a talk-back with writers and actors follows. \$40 for two nights.
